1. Attend each meeting, or call if not able to attend each meeting.
2. Find out when next meeting is, after missing one.

Leaders are told they are not expected to call or email with reminder

- Put meeting dates, times, etc on our calendar and attend
- Get my own supplies or reimburse project leader if provided by them.
- Work on projects in addition to meetings;
- Attend a majority of project meetings; inform project leader if I am unable to attend or if I need to drop the project
- Help set up and/or clean up after each meeting
- Give a project report at club meetings
- Exhibit at the county fair in this project, or a demonstration, or public speaking
