SUPER FARMER COMPETITION

Saturday, July 11, 2009

Registration Begins at 4:00 PM – Competition Starts at 5:00 PM

Entry Fee: \$10 Per Team

DIVISIONS:

Adult Division: Participants 19 Years and Older, 2-Person Coed Teams (1 Male, 1 Female)
Prizes are \$150 for 1st Place & \$75 for 2nd Place

FFA Division or Any Youth Age 14 to 18, 2-Person Coed Teams (1 Male, 1 Female)
Prizes are \$75 for 1st Place & \$50 for 2nd Place

4-H Division or Any Youth Age 8 to 13, 4-Person Coed Teams (2 Male, 2 Female)
Prizes are \$50 for 1st Place & \$25 for 2nd Place

EVENTS:

Post Driving: Contestants will drive steel posts to a specified depth. Each team member will be required to participate. Penalties may be assessed for failure to drive posts to the designated depth.

Milking: Contestants will be required to milk a goat and then deliver the milk, where they will have to fill a specified container. One team member will be responsible for milking, while the other will be responsible for delivering the milk and filling the container.

Hog Sorting: Contestants will sort one hog from a group, catch the hog, and move it to another pen. One team member catch the hog, then transfer it to the other team member who will transport it to the new pen.

Bale Moving: Contestants will be required to load a stack of hay bales and relocate them to a new stack. Penalties may be assessed for broken bales.

Egg Gathering: Contestants will gather a dozen eggs and deliver them safely to another location. One team member will collect the eggs from nests, then toss them to the other team member who will load them into a basket. Penalties will be assessed for broken eggs.

Pen Building: Contestants will work together to construct a livestock pen using gates or other material provided for the task.

RULES:

1. This will be a timed event with the team completing the tasks in the fastest time being the winner.
2. In the 4-H Division, only 4 events will be used and may be modified.
3. Penalties will be assessed as an addition of time for each infraction.
4. Events are subject to change at the discretion of the fair board.
5. Intentional damage to any materials used for this competition, or abuse to livestock by contestants will result in immediate disqualification of the team and all entry fees will be forfeited.
6. Each team must submit a completed entry form found on the following page along with their entry fee during registration one hour prior to the competition.

4-H Building Showcase

Missouri 4-H Youth Programs are under the direction of University of Missouri Extension, University of Missouri and Lincoln University.

“Learning by Doing” is the basis of 4-H work, and each year thousands of young Missourians between the ages of 8 and 19 do just that.

Besides developing practical skills and knowledge, 4-H’ers are developing “life skills.” Under the leadership of more than 9,000 adult volunteers, 4-H members learn to make sound decisions, work cooperatively in groups and develop a sense of self-worth and accomplishment. 4-H also fosters leadership, as older youth share their talents with younger 4-H’ers.

We salute all Missouri 4-H members, volunteers and families.

Showcase Guidelines

1. Items made by 4-H members should reflect the skills they have learned in their 4-H project, the needs and interests of the 4-H'er, and quality workmanship. Use the 4-H project literature and the "Clover" for ideas and criteria.
2. Items displayed must:
 - Be made in the current year
 - Be the work of the 4-H members
 - 4-H member must be enrolled in the project
3. Items must receive a blue-ribbon at the Sullivan County Fair to be chosen as a Missouri State Fair exhibit. **Items are not re-judged at the State Fair, MSF exhibits receive a blue ribbon and a premium.**
4. Items are displayed at the risk of the individual 4-H member. The 4-H faculty, staff and Extension Centers are not responsible for loss or damage to items.
5. For all projects the 4-H member may display "**any item made**" in that project. This includes notebooks, file cards, photo displays, posters, or educational displays. Regardless of project, the following dimensions must be used. Items which do not comply with size or other specifications will not be displayed or receive a premium or ribbon. **Some projects have specific requirements, please read below!**

Poster - No larger than 14" x 22"; flat only; do not fasten three-dimensional items to the poster.

Photo Display - see guidelines for Photography project (below)

Educational Display - Must not exceed 11 inches in height, 12 inches in depth (front to back) and 14 inches in width. Must include three-dimensional items and stand-alone. **(Posters with items taped to them do not qualify as an educational display. Science fair display boards are too large.)**

Electrical Items – should be made in accordance with the National Electrical code. Consult power suppliers or electricians for code requirements. Battery operated items are also eligible items. See guidelines for Electricity project below.

Working Models – These exhibits should show how things actually work (cutaway-sections of motors or computers) or can be used to help people identify parts such as parts of a motor or computer. Many times these exhibits are considered "hands-on" and can be handled by visitors. Working models should require floor space no larger than 14" X 22".

Individual Project Guidelines:

Breads- samples will be called for locally; however, samples are not needed for MSF exhibits. Bread products should be displayed in mini versions (portions of 1/3 to 1/4 of a larger total product.) Please send items on disposable plates only, unless it is a gift package. Please do not use expensive or keepsake containers.

Clothing and Textiles - Be sure to double tag all clothing items.

Decorated Cakes - The use of forms or pans is recommended. **Cakes should not exceed 13" in height or at the base.** Cake boards should not exceed 1" margin on each side of cake pan or form. **Must only use Royal Icing, Rolled Fondant or commercial product (i.e. Dapp) that will harden and preserve the decorated cake.** (No real cakes, Butter crème icing or tube/gel icing - displays containing these items will be considered ineligible and will be rejected.)

Entomology - Box must be exactly 18" long x 24" wide and 3 1/2" deep to fit in display racks. The insects should be named, labeled, and mounted so the boxes can be displayed horizontally. Securely fasten display cover with tape or screws. No handles or knobs. If a member's entomology collection is displayed in more than one box, the member may send only one box for display.

Electricity- exhibits using batteries such as circuit boards should not have the wires connected to the battery; rather the wires should be taped behind the battery. Another option is to not attach a battery but indicate "battery goes here." This is to prevent potential fire hazards.

Food & Nutrition – exhibits must adhere to these guidelines:

1. Food must be of reasonable quality to keep more than a week. Do not send food items that will spoil quickly such as casseroles, pizza, cream pies; items made with cream cheese, etc.
2. Submit food items on paper or disposable plates. Plastic wrap will be removed so drying of the food will extend display life of the product. Please do not use expensive or keepsake containers.
3. Samples are needed for local judging.
4. Biscuits, cookies, muffins and other small items should be four per plate. Cakes should be displayed in mini-versions (portions of 1/3 to 1/4 of a larger total product.)

Gardening - The number in parentheses is the number of items to be displayed. The 4-H'er must have grown the vegetables. The following guidelines should be followed:

1. Vegetables must be of reasonable quality to keep more than a week.
2. Use disposable containers (paper plates or boxes) to display items.

Geology – box must be exactly 18" long x 24" wide and 3 1/2" deep to fit in display racks at MSF. Plexiglas or plastic covers are preferred. No handles or knobs. Specimens should be labeled and mounted so the boxes can be displayed. Rocks need to be attached in the box securely. If a member's collection is displayed in more than one box, the member may send only one box to the MSF. Boxes will be displayed upright in racks at MSF.

Horticulture- Live plants or cut specimens must be displayed in a container no larger than 8" in diameter. 4-H member must have grown the flowers used.

Photography – The following guidelines are requirements for 4-H photography exhibits:

1. All photos should be mounted on an 11" x 14" mat board, **not to exceed 1/8" in thickness**. Materials such as poster board or foam core board are not acceptable mounting materials.
2. Photographers may mount the photograph to the mat board using an acceptable adhesive or approved corner mounts.
3. No captions, titles, or writing on the mat board. The picture should tell the story.
4. Margins are at the discretion of the photographer.
5. No photos using glass and/or wooden, brass, plastic frames, etc.
6. Photos can be matted with a single window colored mat if appropriate.
7. To protect exhibits from dust and moisture, photos should be placed in a two-gallon zip-lock-style bag or wrapped in plastic.
8. Photo stories should follow the above guidelines and consist of no more than 4 photographs
9. Include name, address and county on back of photo.

For definitions and the complete guidelines governing 4-H photography exhibits, please see <http://4h.missouri.edu/go/events/statefair/photoguidelines.pdf>. Exhibits that do not adhere to these guidelines will be disqualified. These exhibits will not be displayed and will not receive premiums or ribbons.

Scrapbooking exhibits should be only 1 page representative of the complete scrapbook.

1. Size not to exceed 12" x 12'.
2. All pages should be in clear protective sleeve or clear zipper bag. Do not frame.

Shooting Sports- exhibits should contain no live ammunition and arrow points should be removed.

6. **No early removal or checkout of items is permitted.** Items which are not properly checked in or out of the 4-H building, will not be awarded premium money and/or ribbons.
7. If an exhibit which receives a "State Fair" award is too large to be mailed or delivered to the Missouri State Fair, a photo of that item may be sent instead. One photo, no larger than 5x7, not mounted on anything, may be submitted instead of the actual project.
8. Building Exhibits will be released on Saturday July 11th from 12:00 PM to 3:00 PM

LIVESTOCK RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. **ENTRY RULES:** The Sullivan County Fair is open to the following exhibitors:
 Horse, swine, sheep, goats, small animals, bucket calves (4-H ages 8 to 12) and beef entries by:
 - All eligible youth enrolled in 4-H work in the State of Missouri. (No Clover Kids may exhibit.)
 - All eligible members of an active FFA Chapter in the State of Missouri.
 - All 4-H and FFA Entries show in the same class.
 - Youth under 7 years of age are eligible to exhibit in each species Pee Wee class.
2. Missouri Department of Agriculture Health Regulations will be followed. Please review complete Animal Health Regulations found on the following pages of the Fair Book. **REQUIRED CERTIFICATES OF VETERINARY INSPECTION MUST BE CHECKED BY FAIR STAFF PRIOR TO UNLOADING OF ANY ANIMALS.**
3. Exhibitors must have registration papers to be eligible for any purebred breeding or market animal classes. A breeder's certificate, performance pedigree or registration paper is required to be eligible for steer (breed) classes. These papers will accompany the animals at check-in time at the fair.
4. Exhibitors must furnish their own bedding.
5. All FFA and 4-H exhibitors must be members in good standing in their respective state and county organizations. All animals exhibited must be part of their supervised farming or project program. All records or reports required by their respective organizations must be kept.
6. Animals are to arrive and unload at their assigned time. All animals will be stalled as they arrive, and will be released following their respective shows at the discretion of the department chairperson per rule #7.
7. Exhibitors are to clean barn and stall area before leaving. Livestock Chairperson or fair officials' approval must be obtained before animals and exhibitors are released. Exhibitors who fail to comply will forfeit premiums.
8. Livestock unloaded but not shown because they are unmanageable or a hazard to other participants will be dismissed from the show. Sullivan County livestock will be sold last at the livestock sale if dismissed from show. Dismissal is at the discretion of the livestock chair.
9. No trophies, plaques, or other prizes are to be awarded to a non-blue ribbon project.
10. Livestock is to be exhibited in a presentable condition.
11. All livestock is to be exhibited by the 4-H or FFA member. If a 4-H/FFA member will be absent from the fair, they must receive prior approval from the species chairman or Fair Board to have another 4-H/FFA member exhibit for them. If an exhibitor has two animals showing in the same class, another 4-H or FFA member may help show the second animal. No outside help while showing unless the animal is unruly, then assistance may be permitted or the animal dismissed.
12. The Livestock Chairperson reserves the right to mouth the Champion and Reserve Champion Steer.
13. Premiums will be paid as money allows, not to exceed fifty cents (\$0.50) per point.
14. Pre-registration with entry fee is to be POSTMARKED on or before July 1st. Late entry fees (including the day of the show) will be charged an additional \$1. Registration forms are available at: <http://extension.missouri.edu/sullivan/4-h.shtml>.
15. There will be absolutely NO ALCOHOL ALLOWED during 4-H and FFA activities and events.
16. ANY situation not covered in these rules will be handled according to the rules of the Missouri State Fair. However, the Sullivan County Fair reserves the right to interpret all rules and regulations and their decisions will be final.
17. Abuse to Animals: Should any physical abuse be observed toward an animal, either in the barns or in the showing by the exhibitor or agents, the livestock chairperson has the authority to eliminate exhibitor and animal from the show.
18. 4-H Members will be asked to show their Quality Assurance Card and are required by 4-H rules and regulations to be certified in the Livestock Quality Assurance Program. (Does not apply to FFA exhibitors.)
19. Points will be awarded on the following basis:

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION

The following is a SUMMARY, and not a reprint of 2 CSR 30-2.040 Animal Health Requirements for exhibition regulations. Contact the Missouri State Veterinarian's office at (573) 751-4359 for clarification on the following.

1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection/General Requirements.

- A. All animals must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection unless specifically exempted. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall state that the animals are free of visible signs of contagious, infectious, or communicable disease, describe the animal(s) by species, breed, sex and age. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall reflect all data for required test and vaccinations, all dates, results and the name of the laboratory.
- B. The Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is valid for thirty (30) days.
- C. Animals with active lesions of ringworm or warts will not be permitted to exhibit and shall be subject to isolation and expulsion.
- D. Sales scheduled in association with exhibitions must employ a veterinarian to examine animals and process Certificate of Veterinary Inspection for change of ownership. The following are requirements for animals EXHIBITED in Missouri. Animal sold in addition to being exhibited must meet the entry requirements of Missouri.

2. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE IN MISSOURI.

- A. Intrastate (cattle in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 - 1. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required.
 - 2. Brucellosis – no test or vaccination is required.
 - 3. Tuberculosis – no test is required.
- B. Interstate (cattle from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 - 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required with official individual identification for each animal listed.
 - 2. Brucellosis –
 - A. Cattle from Brucellosis-Free States.
 - 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required with official individual identification for each animal listed.
 - 2. All cattle may enter without a brucellosis test
 - 3. Steer(s). No test required but the steer(s) must be listed and identified on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - B. Sexually intact cattle from brucellosis Class A states. All test-eligible animals must be tested and negative within thirty (30) days prior to entry except cattle from a certified brucellosis-free herd. The certified herd number and date of the last herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; and
 - 3. Tuberculosis.
 - A. Beef – all beef breeding cattle six (2) months of age or over must meet one of the following requirements:
 - 1. Must obtain an entry permit.
 - 2. Have a negative tuberculosis test within sixty (60) days of shipment; test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; or
 - 3. Move from an accredited tuberculosis-free herd (herd test date must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection; or
 - 4. Move directly from a herd of origin that has had one (1) complete negative herd test within one (1) year (date of test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection).

3. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR SWINE

- A. Intrastate (swine in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 - 1. All swine must be free of clinical signs of infectious or contagious disease.
 - 2. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required
 - 3. Brucellosis – no test required
 - 4. Pseudorabies – no test required
- B. Interstate (swine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 - 1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required. All swine must be identified by eartag, ear notch, tattoo and individually listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 2. Brucellosis –
 - A. Breeding swine originating from brucellosis-free states

may exhibit without a brucellosis test.

- B. Breeding swine originating from a state having a brucellosis status less than free states must be tested negative within sixty (60) days prior to exhibition except breeding swine from a validated brucellosis-free herd. The validated herd number and date of last validating test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

3. Pseudorabies –

- A. Swine originating from a state classified as Stage V the National Pseudorabies (PRV) Eradication Plan may exhibit without a pseudorabies test.
- B. All other swine must be tested negative within sixty (60) days prior to exhibition except swine from a qualified pseudorabies-free herd. The qualified herd number and date of last qualifying test must be listed on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.

4. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR SHEEP.

- A. Intrastate (sheep in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 - 1. Sheep must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 - 2. All sheep, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by and official scrapie eartag and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 3. No test required
- B. Interstate (sheep from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only)
 - 1. Sheep must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 - 2. All sheep, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by and official scrapie eartag and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 3. No test required

5. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR GOATS.

- A. Intrastate (goats in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 - 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease.
 - 2. All goats, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag or any other means of permanent identification approved by the state veterinarian and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 3. No test required
- B. Interstate (goats from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 - 1. Goats must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease
 - 2. All goats, regardless of age or gender, must be individually identified by an official scrapie eartag or any other means of permanent identification approved by the state veterinarian and be listed on a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection.
 - 3. No test required

6. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS EQUINE.

- A. Intrastate (equine in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 - 1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an Infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.
 - 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is not required.
 - 3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
- B. Interstate (equine from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 - 1. Equine that are to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of an infectious or contagious disease. Any equine showing

signs of infectious or contagious diseases at an exhibition may be excused by the official inspecting veterinarian. When an official inspecting veterinarian is present; all equine will be subject to daily inspection.

2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
3. All equine (except nursing foals accompanied by their dams) must be accompanied by a current VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart showing the graphic description of all markings needed for identification, or microchip, or legible tattoo, or unique registered brand. A certified photocopy or certified facsimile of the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart may be accepted for the purpose of exhibition.
4. Alteration or substitution of any information on any VS Form 10-11 including certified photocopy or certified facsimile or any official copy of a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection shall cause the document to be invalid and in violation of sections 267.010 to 267.730, RSMo, and may result in civil penalties not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per violation and subject to expulsion.
5. A six (6) - month passport from states with which there is a reciprocal agreement will be accepted in lieu of VS Form 10-11. These passports must have proof of a negative EIA test within thirty (30) days of the date of application of the passport and permanent identification for each horse by means of registered brand, legible tattoo, or microchip to be recorded on the passport and the VS Form 10-11 or any officially recognized state EIA test chart, along with other identifying characteristics. In the event of confirmed vesicular stomatitis in any of the states with which reciprocal agreements exist, use of the six (6) – month passport will be suspended by the state veterinarian of Missouri.
6. Venezuelan Equine Encephalomyelitis (VEE) vaccination and entry permit is required prior to entry on equine originating from states in which VEE has been diagnosed within the preceding twelve (12) months.
7. Any equine originating from a premise under quarantine for Vesicular Stomatitis shall obtain an entry permit and must include the statement on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection that “the equine listed have not been exposed to Vesicular Stomatitis or located within (10) miles of premises quarantined for Vesicular Stomatitis within the past thirty (30) days”.

7. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR POULTRY AND WATERFOWL

- A. Intrastate (poultry and waterfowl in Missouri moving for exhibition only)
 1. All poultry and waterfowl to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any infectious or contagious disease.
 2. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required
 3. Pullorum-Typhoid test. All poultry (except waterfowl) exhibited shall be tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within ninety (90) days prior to exhibition or originate from a flock approved by the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) or an equivalent program which as been tested within the past twelve (12) months with no change of ownership. This information shall

be documented on a VS Form 9-2 (see 2 CSR 30-8.020) or similar certificate which shall accompany the poultry to the exhibition and shall be made available on request.

- B. Interstate (poultry and waterfowl entering Missouri for exhibition only)
 1. All poultry and waterfowl to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any infectious or contagious disease.
 2. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required
 3. Pullorum-Typhoid test. All poultry (except waterfowl) exhibited shall be tested negative for pullorum-typhoid within ninety (90) days prior to exhibition or originate from a flock approved by the National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) or an equivalent program which as been tested within the past twelve (12) months with no change of ownership. This information shall be documented on a VS Form 9-2 (see 2 CSR 30-8.020) or similar certificate which shall accompany the poultry to the exhibition and shall be made available on request.
 4. An entry permit is required.
 - C. Requirements for Sponsoring Exhibitions for Poultry and Waterfowl.
 1. An official representing the person or organization sponsoring the exhibition shall notify the state veterinarian no later than thirty (30) days prior to the exhibition giving the names, place, inclusive dates and times of event.
 2. Record Keeping. The sponsor of the exhibition shall compile a list of all poultry and waterfowl present at the exhibition. The list shall contain the name and address of each owner, the number, species, breed, variety, type, sex and pullorumtyphoid status of all poultry present. A copy of this list shall be retained by the sponsor of the exhibition for at least twelve (12) months and shall be made available upon request to a representative of the department.
 3. Inspection. All poultry and waterfowl to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any Infectious or contagious disease. A representative of the department shall have access to the exhibits and may conduct inspections and tests as deemed necessary.
- #### 8. EXHIBITION REQUIREMENTS FOR RATITE IN THE STATE OF MISSOURI
- A. Intrastate (ratites in Missouri moving for exhibition only).
 1. All ratites to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any infectious or contagious disease.
 2. No Certificate of Veterinary Inspection is required.
 3. Ratites must be officially identified by leg band, wing band or microchip.
 4. No test is required.
 - B. Interstate (ratites from another state entering Missouri for exhibition only).
 1. All ratites to be exhibited must be free of clinical signs of any infectious or contagious disease.
 2. Ratites must be accompanied by a Certificate of Veterinary inspection showing official identification (leg band, wing band or microchip).
