6. Small animals are released at 12:00 noon.
7. All participants will receive an award.
8. All entrants will need to sign an injury waiver form for insurance purposes.

4. All bicycles are to be kept in the area of the bicycle safety activities only. They are not to be ridden anywhere else on the fair grounds.

2. Pedaling and braking
3. Signaling, mounting, dismounting
4. Turning around
5. Emergency turn and stop

Participants will have the opportunity to throw a football through a suspended hoop. The distance of the throw will depend on participant's age.

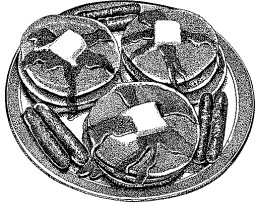
## **THREE-LEGGED RACES**

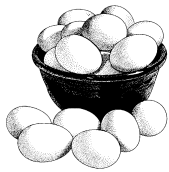
