CODES OF CONDUCT

The Audrain County 4-H program strives to develop competent, confident and connected youth and adults of good character. All programs and activities will create an atmosphere that encourages good character, accountability and enhances ethical decision-making. Character development is a cornerstone of the Audrain County 4-H program.

4-H programs and activities will help participants develop in their personal character the positive traits of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring and citizenship. These six character traits will be guiding principles for all policy and decisions related to the Audrain County 4-H program. The following are codes of conduct for all (participants, relatives, spectators, etc.) who attend the activities of the Audrain County 4-H program.

Trustworthiness:

Do not deceive, cheat or steal. This includes accurate registration information, fair grooming practices and borrowing only what you have permission to borrow.

Respect:

Treat others with respect, using good manners and appropriate language. Deal peaceably with anger, insults and disagreements. This includes no threats, inappropriate language or physical violence.

Responsibility:

Always do and be your best. Use self-control and be accountable for the choices you make. Be graceful in winning and losing. Be honest and encouraging.

Fairness:

Follow the rules and do not blame others carelessly. Make sure you know the rules for your project and follow them carefully. Ignorance of the rules is not an excuse. Each rule applies to all involved in the event. Exceptions to the rules lead to an unfair situation.

Caring:

Show others you care by expressing gratitude and helping others. This includes thank you notes to sponsors of events, 4-H personnel and community supporters. This also includes being kind to others.

Citizenship:

Do your part to make our community a better place by obeying the laws and rules. Respect those in authority. This includes judges, committee chairpersons and 4-H personnel.

Consequences:

Any who choose not to follow these guidelines will be asked to leave the event. If an individual is asked to leave an event, he/she will be on a probationary period of one (1) year. A second infraction during the probationary period will result in the individual being banned from Audrain County 4-H events for a six (6) month period from that date. A third infraction will result in a ban lasting one (1) year from that date.

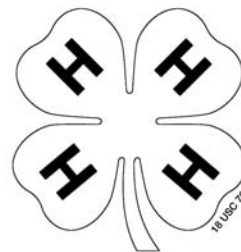
