1. Exhibitors are limited to one (1) entry in each class. (Except where otherwise stated.)
2. All entries must be neatly labeled on tags which are provided by the fair.
3. All entries must be in place between 9:00 a.m. and 12:00 noon on Wednesday, July 10, except Floriculture which will be in place 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, July 11.
4. Exhibits may not be removed until Saturday, July 13 between 9:00 a.m. and 11:00 a.m. **Absolutely no early removal of exhibits.**
5. **Ribbons will only be awarded unless otherwise specified by each specific division. If a specific division wishes to award prizes other than ribbons, then the chairperson(s) will be responsible for distribution of award(s). The Bates County Fair will no longer be sponsoring premiums.**
6. **The judges and committee members will be the only persons permitted in the area while judging is in process.**
7. All committee chairman will complete: (a) entry sheet(s) of exhibitors; (b) judge placement of entries (B,R,W); (c) total premium money needed for payout of department; (d) return information to Bates County Fair secretary/treasurer after judging of entries.

Bates County Fair—Open Division contests receive dozens of entries ranging from agriculture produce and food preparation to painting, crafts and clothing construction and needlework. The best-of-show awards are judged as the best overall entry of each category. (These will be displayed on a special table. Judges would make the selections.)

Cleaning and Preparing Vegetables:

Root vegetables should be clean. Clean carefully with a soft brush or dampened cloth, not rubbing hard enough to destroy the natural luster. Do not scrub. Onions should not be peeled except for loose skin. Any item entered for exhibit which is not listed in the class will be displayed, but not judged. **Zip lock bags for corn and fruits!**

1. Any amateur gardener or flower arranger may enter.
2. Entries will be received between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, July 11. NO entries accepted after 11:00 a.m. NO EXCEPTIONS!

3. Judging will begin at 1:00 p.m. on Thursday, July 11. Judges decisions are final.
4. No one allowed in flower show area during judging except authorized personnel. Show open to public when judging is completed.
5. We will endeavor to care for all exhibits but cannot be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits or personal property.

Horticulture Rules

1. Containers will be furnished.
2. General rules apply.
3. Specimen flowers must be grown by exhibitor.
4. The botanical name and variety or cultivar will be given preference over only the common name.
5. Specimen stem length should be in good relation to size of bloom. Foliage should be clean and groomed but do not remove foliage, even if damaged.
6. Junior exhibitors must be 14 years old or under.
7. Award of Merit will be given in each Horticulture Section.

Open photography exhibits must be done according to instruction printed in the Fair book; those not in conformity with instructions will not be accepted. No exceptions will be allowed. PLEASE use quality mat boards!

1. All entries must be in by 12 noon; no exceptions!
2. Laser and digital prints are permitted.
3. Print sizes should be 5x7 or 8x10 only.
4. Exhibitor—display each photograph in a large reclosable zip top bags (protects for display)
5. 5x7 photos should be mounted on 8x10 mat boards
6. 8x10 photos should be mounted on 11x13 mat boards
7. If photograph is vertical, mount photograph vertically.
