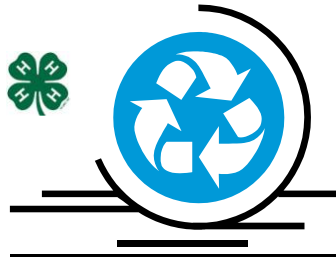

- A welcome screen appears to guide through the course

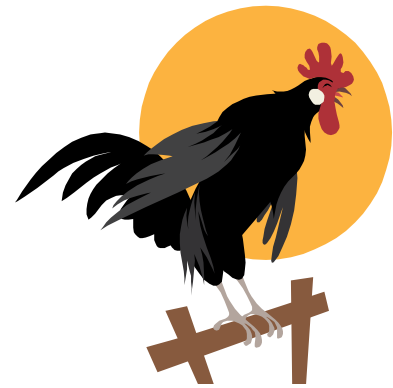
