MDC annual Free Fishing Days, Any person may fish state waters without a permit; trout permit or prescribed area daily tag during Free Fishing Days. Requirements for special permits may still apply at some county, city or private areas. Normal regulations, such as size and daily limits, still apply. For a list of Free Fishing Days events visit www.mdc.mo.gov/node/3675. Some conservation areas where Free Fishing Days events are scheduled will have equipment that you can borrow.

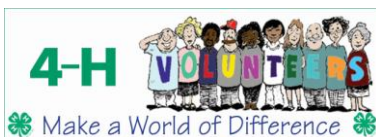

What is Global Citizenship?

This is a new concept, a new word, for what has been described in the ever popular Wikipedia as “A moral and ethical disposition which can guide the understanding of individuals or groups of local and global contexts, and remind them of their relative responsibilities within various communities. The key tenets of global citizenship include respect for any and all fellow global citizens, regardless of race, religion or creed and give rise to a universal sympathy beyond the barriers of nationality.” So what does this actually mean for us? Citizenship is more than a paper, status, birth certificate or passport. It means that we are all citizens of the world so we have a responsibility to respect others, recognize the equality of all human beings and combat all forms of discrimination by fostering a spirit of tolerance and peace among human beings. We need to see beyond our borders to a world where we can become contributing citizens.

The definition “4-H is a community of young people across America, who are learning leadership, citizenship and life skills” reminds us that we are learning about leadership in our local

community, we are learning citizenship concepts in the most diverse country in the world and we are learning life skills that will prepare us to be global citizens leading and taking care of our world.

4-H is described in our pledge in a global context: My head to clearer thinking, my heart to greater loyalty, my hands to larger service, and my health to better living, for my club, my community, my country and **my world**. 4-H is recognized in several parts of the world as one of the leading youth development programs that teaches youth to become contributing members of their communities.

The first line of the 4-H creed states, “I believe in 4-H club for the opportunity it will give me to become a useful citizen.” Be a global citizen, a citizen of the world who respects other cultures, languages, religions, creeds, colors, nationalities, costumes, traditions, races, ethnicity and more. Make the most of each day and the people with whom you interact because not only are you a citizen in the MOST diverse country in the world, but you are a citizen of the world!
