

2011 Boone County Fair 4-H/FFA Sheep Show

- Pen Set Up:** Tuesday, July 19 @ 5:30 pm
- Arrival Time:** Monday, July 25 @ 10:00 am
Monday, July 25 must be in place by Noon. **Sheep must be checked by a veterinarian prior to unloading**
- Weigh-In/Scan:** Monday, July 25 @ 2:00 pm. Animals must be slick sheared.
- Exhibitor Mtgs:** Tuesday, July 26 @ 4:00 pm **Mandatory meeting.**
Friday, July 29 @ 9:30 am
Saturday, July 30 @ 1:00 pm **Mandatory for sale exhibitors**
- Shows:** Tuesday, July 26 @ 6:00 pm Lead Line Class then Market Lambs

- Release Time:** Following the show for non-sale animals.

General regulations:

1. Rules listed in the General Rules section in addition to following rules will apply to the Sheep Show.
2. All exhibitors must complete the required Show Me Quality Assurance (SMQA) training for their age in order to be eligible to show.
3. All breeding sheep must be owned and under the care of the member enrolled in the project by **Wednesday, June 15, 2011**. Market lamb ownership by Friday, **May 13, 2011**.
4. Within each breed, each exhibitor is limited to **two entries in single classes**.
5. Breeding sheep must be registered in their respective association with the exception of commercial ewe and ram classes (a commercial sheep is one ineligible for registration). Each

registration paper must show the exhibitors name as owner. Registration papers will be checked.

6. Market lambs will be shown in classes as black face, white face, speckled face, and all other breeds. Classes will be broken by weight. Market lambs may be of any breed or crossbred. Wethers or ewe lambs may be shown. **Rams are not allowed. (Lambs shown in the market lamb classes can not show in any other classes).** EXAMPLE: Ewe lamb shown in market lamb class cannot show in commercial ewe lamb class. Commercial ewe lamb shown in commercial ewe lamb class cannot show in market lamb class.
7. In accordance with the Missouri Department of Agriculture and Missouri State Fair health guidelines, all sheep and goats (including wethers) must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (health certificate) to be eligible to show. This health certificate must have been written within 30 days of exhibition. All sheep must also be identified either by ear tag, electronic implant, or tattoo. A veterinarian will check lambs prior to unloading.
8. All Boone County market lambs **are required to be weighed at the County Weigh-In held (Note Change of Date) Monday, May 16** at the Boone County Fairgrounds between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. All wether lambs **must be banded prior to weigh-in.**
9. All market lambs **must be scrapie tagged for identification.** Lambs must be tagged at the time of the May 16 weigh-in. Slick shearing is required. An exhibitor may show a total of two market lambs. All market lamb exhibitors **must exhibit their lamb without assistance.**
10. Each exhibitor may sell only one blue ribbon or red ribbon market lamb. **Exception:** If an exhibitor has both Champion and Reserve Champion, **they will be required to sell both lambs.**
11. All 4-H and FFA members in Missouri are eligible to show sheep in all classes except the Home Raised Market Lamb Class. Only Boone County exhibitors may show in this class. **Home Raised definition can be found in the General Rules section.**

SHOWMANSHIP

Showmanship will be for Boone County exhibitors only. Showmanship will be judged at the discretion of the judge. The exhibitor winning showmanship in the market lamb class will not be eligible to compete in the breed show for showmanship.

SHEEP SHOW CLASSES Section E

Instructions for entering Class Numbers on the Boone County Fair Entry Form:

Classes will be entered by a two step process:

Step 1: The first part of the class number will use one of the following breed or face color ID's:

Step 2: The Breed or Face ID is followed by one of the following class numbers:

- 1 Junior Lead Class (See attached rules)
- 2 Single Market Lamb (100 pounds minimum)
- 3 Home Raised Market Lamb (Boone County Exhibitors Only) 1 per exhibitor
- 4 Pair of Market Lambs (Any breed)
- 5 Yearling Ram, 1 and under 2 years
- 6 Senior Ram Lamb 9/1/10-12/31/10
- 7 Junior Ram Lamb after 1/1/11
- 8 Pair of Ram Lambs
- 9 Yearling Ewe 1 and under 2 years
- 10 Pair of Ewes, 1 and under 2 years
- 11 Senior Ewe Lamb 9/1/10-12/31/10
- 12 Junior Ewe Lamb after 1/1/11
- 13 Pair of Ewe Lambs
- 14 Flock

ENTRY EXAMPLE: If you have a Corriedale Jr. Ewe, a Black Face Sr. Ewe, and a speckle face market lamb that you want to show, this is how you would fill out the Entry Form:
