

1. All entries must be in the Cass County University Outreach and Extension Office, 302 S. Main; Harrisonville, Mo 64701 by **Monday, July 10, 2009**. Entries received after that date (determined by postmark) will be accepted at **DOUBLE THE STALL FEE or TAKEN FROM PREMIUMS!**
2. No youth can exhibit more than two animals in any class with the exception of market animals, poultry, or rabbits.
3. The first place blue ribbon winners in each class may compete for Champion. The animal standing second to the Champion, in its respective class, is eligible to compete for Reserve Champion, if it is a blue ribbon.
4. All animals are to remain on the grounds until the show is completed, unless they are released by the Fair Review Board or show superintendents. Premiums will be forfeited if animals are removed without permission or stall is not cleaned after the show.
5. Separate classes will be provided as needed for each breed. Classes of breed will be shown, provided there are three entries of the same breed, as recognized by the breed association as purebred. Other wise, animals will be shown in the all other breed class.
6. Health papers (when necessary) must be presented when asked by the Show Veterinarians, whose decision is final regarding the dismissal of an animal due to health reasons.
7. No alcohol or illegal substance allowed on the grounds.
8. CODE OF ETHICS: Believing it is in the best interest of all 4-H/FFA members to maintain a reputation of integrity, and to present a wholesome and progressive image, the Cass County Junior Livestock Association sets forth the following regulations:

4-H and FFA members and their families are expected to conduct themselves to the best traditions of their respective organizations. Inappropriate conduct (drinking, stealing, vandalism, abusive behavior, and indiscreet behavior) will not be tolerated.
9. Any violation of the rule will be grounds for disqualifying the 4-H/FFA member, and asking the young person and their family to leave the grounds.
9. SHOWING: Exhibitors must show their animals. The Show Superintendents may permit other 4-H or FFA members to show an animal in case of illness or physical handicap. In cases where a member has more than one animal in a class, another exhibitor must show the second animal. No adults may show animals for an exhibitor.
10. Exhibitors need to be Show-Me Quality Assurance certified and will be expected to observe Missouri State Fair grooming rules and treatment practices.
11. **ALL MARKET ANIMALS (BEEF, SHEEP, GOATS, SWINE) MUST BE OWNED BY EXHIBITOR BY MAY 1, 2009. BREEDING SWINE MUST BE OWNED BY MAY 15, 2009. BREEDING BEEF, DAIRY CATTLE, AND MEAT GOATS MUST BE OWNED BY JUNE 1, 2009. BREEDING SHEEP MUST BE OWNED BY JULY 1, 2009.** Exhibitors are expected to do a minimum of ¾ of the work after ownership date. Project Leader verification is required on the entry form.
12. All Cass County Market Steers, Market Lambs, and Market Goats MUST participate in an official weigh-in, supervised by an Extension Specialist and/or Agriculture Educator, to participate in the Cass County Junior Livestock Auction.
