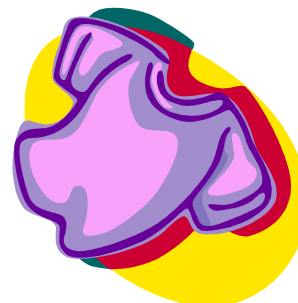

KC Global Summit

The 2012 Kansas City 4-H Global Summit is March 14-17! The cost is \$275 for youth and \$380 for adults.

The Summit provides opportunities for youth to explore careers, technology, environment and cultural diversity in a global society. Program features include:

- Tours to Kansas City area businesses and organizations (i.e., Bayer Science, Lee Jeans, Board of Trade, EPA Chemical Lab, Federal Reserve, Kansas City hospital, Smith Electric Vehicles and Farmland Foods)
- Workshops showcasing a variety of careers (i.e., engineering, international law, CSI, archeology, DJ Audio, nuclear pharmacy, veterinary medicine, law enforcement, marketing and geo science)
- Cultural events - ethnic enrichment festival, including food, music and art
- Dances, group events and other programs that provide opportunities for participants to meet youth from Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, and Oklahoma.

4-H opportunities and trips qualify for excused school absence as evidenced in Missouri State Statute. Each youth that registers receives a "school absence" letter from the State 4-H office that references the statute. Registration is due by December 1, 2011.
