SHARE THE FUN GUIDELINES

A fun evening is planned for all 4-H Families and is open to the public. A committee is appointed by the 4-H Executive Committee to co-ordinate Share the Fun Night.

CORONATION

The coronation of 4-H Royalty is a special part of the Share the Fun Celebration. Each club should elect outstanding members as candidates. Each candidate must complete a Royalty Application and attend an Interview. 4-H Royalty are introduced during special county events, may ride in community parades, assist with 4-H Recognition Night, and with Share the fun Night the following year. They are 4-H Ambassadors to the community. A candidate may apply more than once, however, Royalty winners may only win once in their age division. Deadline for application is final - no late forms can be accepted. Candidates must attend the interview as scheduled. In the case of illness or other problems that prohibit a candidate from attending the interview, if the application was received before the deadline they will be introduced at Share the Fun Night with the other candidates, but they are not eligible to be selected as Royalty.

SHARE THE FUN SKITS AND TALENT SHOW

Each club may present four groups of entertainers. The groups may perform a skit 5-7 minutes long, or present a talent. A Club may have two talents and two skits. Clover Kids may present their own entertainment just for fun or participate with older members but may not participate at the regional level.

Two or three judges score the entertainment and an average is used to score each group.

Clubs are asked to send the title of their presentations and the type of entertainment that it is plus the number of members in the group to the Extension Office by the deadline.

All entertainment should be in good taste and reflect the positive image of 4-H.
