The Garden 'N Grow Program is sponsored and conducted by University of Missouri Extension Master Gardeners of Greater Kansas City. This educational program blends positive youth development and academic learning with horticulture training and community service.

Students will plan, plant, and maintain their own garden plots. Guided by trained Master Gardeners, the development of the whole child is emphasized with a focus on team work.

Sample Lesson Plans:

- The Three Sisters - Students learn about companion planting
- Seed or Weed - Differentiating between crops and weeds
- Shine On! - Understanding the process of photosynthesis
- It's A Plot! - Designing a vegetable garden to scale
- Hot or Not? - An in-depth look at sweet and hot peppers
