**Rules and Regulations:**

1. If there are no pre-registrations by July 6, 2009 there will be no Dog Show(s).
2. ***If no legible address is on the registration form, premium check will not be mailed.***
3. There will be no entry fee/stall fee for the Dog Shows.
4. Please refer to [General Livestock Rules](#) for more information regarding the showing of animals at the Jefferson City Jaycees' Cole County Fair.
5. All animals will have the necessary health papers as required by the State Department of Agriculture and the county fair committee. Exhibitors will produce health papers if requested by the fair committee. Check the [Animal Health Regulations](#) and follow them.
6. Dogs "in season" are not allowed to show.
7. All decisions of the judges are final.
8. Superintendent reserves the right to divide classes as necessary.
9. Time of Show may be adjusted at discretion of Superintendent and Judge.
10. All exhibitors will be expected to keep their exhibit area, including walking path, clean and free of manure and debris.
11. ***Premiums will be disbursed approximately thirty (30) days after last date of fair!***
12. **FAIR PASSES:** Each Exhibitor and any 4-H/FFA immediate family members are eligible to purchase a reduced price season pass for \$10. These passes can be purchased in person at the Jefferson Jaycees Cole County Fairgrounds on July 11, 18, 25 from 8:00am until noon. Anyone not purchasing a season pass by July 25, 2009, will be required to pay the daily admission fee at the gate.
13. Parking in designated areas with parking permit only.

**Rally Obedience**

1. [Entry](#) is open to 4-H/FFA members enrolled in the Dog project in Cole and Osage County.
2. All Cole County 4-H/FFA members must be a "member in good standing" with their club/chapter and officially enrolled in project to receive premiums.
3. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor by April 1, 2009, and be raised in a 4-H or FFA project.
4. All animals should have had prior obedience and/or agility training to be eligible to participate.
5. The purpose of the Rally Obedience Show is to introduce students to novice Rally Obedience competition.
6. Only slip or buckle collars allowed.
7. Teams will each start with 100 points.
8. Deductions will be as follows:
  - a. 1 point is deducted for each occurrence of:
    - i. tight leash
    - ii. poor sits
    - iii. interference with handler
    - iv. slow to respond
    - v. handler repeating commands
    - vi. lack of teamwork
    - vii. out of position
  - b. 3 points deducted for:
    - i. repeating a station
    - ii. knocking cone over
    - iii. lack of control
    - iv. loud or intimidating commands
    - v. excessive barking
  - c. 10 points deducted for: incorrectly performed station
    - i. consistent tight lead
    - ii. dog eliminating in ring
  - d. Non-qualifying:
    - i. dog unmanageable

9. Ribbons will be awarded as follows:
  - a. Blue = Scores between 90-100
  - b. Red = Scores between 80-89
  - c. White = Scores below 79 and below

### Jumpers Show

1. [Entry](#) is open to 4-H/FFA members enrolled in the Dog project in Cole and Osage County.
2. All Cole County 4-H/FFA members must be a “member in good standing” with their club/chapter and officially enrolled in project to receive premiums.
3. Animals must be owned by the exhibitor by April 1, 2009, and be raised in a 4-H or FFA project.
4. All animals should have had prior obedience and/or agility training to be eligible to participate.
5. The purpose of the Jumpers Show is to introduce students to novice Agility Jumping competition.
6. Only slip or buckle collars allowed
7. Teams will each start with 100 points.
8. Deductions will be as follows:
  - a. 5 points deducted for:
    - i. Refusal to take jumps
    - ii. Wrong course
    - iii. Knocked bar
  - b. Non-qualifying score:
    - i. dog leaves the ring
    - ii. dog eliminates in ring
9. Participates may choose to run the course with leash on or off your dog.
10. Judge will measure dogs prior to show.
11. Jumps will be set at the following heights based on the height of the dog:

<u><i>Dog Height</i></u>	<u><i>Jump Height</i></u>
10” and under	8”
14” and under	12”
18” and under	16”
22” and under	20”
22” and over	24”

12. Ribbons will be awarded as follows:
  - a. Blue = Scores between 90-100
  - b. Red = Scores between 80-89
  - c. White = Scores 79 and below

### Fun Show

1. [Entry](#) is open to the public.
2. Any age participant may compete.
3. These classes will be judged based on audience participation.
4. Pre-registration is recommended.
5. Ribbons will be awarded for 1<sup>st</sup> through 3<sup>rd</sup> place.
6. Class Descriptions:
  - a. **Best Tail Wagging** - Dog (not the handler) will be judged on the exuberance of their tail motion.
  - b. **Terrific Pet Tricks** - It doesn't even have to be outrageous. Show off your dog's talent - at anything.
  - c. **Prettiest Female** - In this class, the judges will be looking at grooming and appearance, and all-around condition of the dogs. Class may be split by weight: dogs up to 45 pounds and dogs 46 pounds and over.
  - d. **Most Handsome Male** - In this class, the judges will be looking at grooming and appearance, and all-around condition of the dogs. Class may be split by weight: dogs up to 45 pounds and dogs 46 pounds and over.
