Missouri 4-H Club Membership policy:

Please remember that 4-H and University of Missouri Extension programs are open to all people year-round. This means that a youth may join a 4-H club or group at any time during the year. It also means that a club cannot limit its membership size even when the size of meeting space is a concern. The practice of *open to all* means that any youth can join a 4-H club or group, even if other individuals object to their inclusion. USDA/NIFA policy dictates that 4-H programs do not engage in practices deemed exclusionary. See What is a 4-H Club -

Cole County Policies

Secondary Club Member Policy

- a) The 4-H Member from a surrounding county is encouraged to join their home county's program first. If special circumstances exist that make it a burden to participate in their home county, the member must request in writing their reason for wanting to join Cole County's program.
- b) Project Leaders will determine if there is room to accommodate the youth.
- c) If accepted, the member must complete the following steps:
 - i) Join a Cole County 4-H club as a second club in 4HOnline
 - ii) Pay Cole County dues plus any club dues
 - iii) Participate in Cole County fundraisers

Adopted May 2015; effective October 2015

Club in Good Standing Policy

- a) Club must hold minimum of four meetings
- b) Must have at least 1 recognized club leader and at least 1 recognized project leader who conducts a meeting and provides a minimum of 6 hours of instruction.
- c) 4-H Member and Volunteer records must be entered in enrollment system in a timely manner (Re-enrollment completed by Jan. 1st)
- d) Plan, Implement and Evaluate a community service project.
- e) Turn in club audit packet by due date.
- f) Participate in rotation of countywide committees and fundraisers.
- g) Appoint a representative to attend 50% of 4-H Council meetings

Clubs not adhering to these policies will have their charter revoked.

Cole County 4-H

"Member in Good Standing" Requirements

- Complete 1 Demonstration during the 4-H year (hands-on, PowerPoint, team, speech, etc.)
- Attend 50% of club/group meetings. New members must attend 50% of meetings from the time of joining a club.
- Enroll in at least 1 project and complete 6 hours of project work receiving guidance from a recognized adult volunteer. Certain projects may require a certified instructor and may have additional requirements (ie. Shooting Sports, SportFishing, Horse Bowl, etc.)
- Club dues paid in timely manner
