- It is a chance for younger members and first time campers to experience 4-H camp on a smaller scale. It allows them a brief glimpse of what camp is like and an opportunity to meet friends and enjoy a camp setting.
- It is an opportunity for parents to see camp facilities and observe activities that go on at camp. Our goal is that this experience will help parents feel more comfortable with letting their child go to camp alone when he/she is ready. It is also a time for families to spend a relaxing, quality educational experience together.
- We have found that this camp has reduced the instances of home-sickness for younger campers when they first come to Regular 4-H camp.
- We have structured the activities to allow families some free time together to enjoy the lake, crafts cabin, hill top sports area or just walking around and reminiscing about your own personal camp days.

Location: Camp Clover Point- Lake of the Ozark State Park

Navigate: Highway 54 to Highway 42 East to Highway 134, Turn right at log cabin. Follow the signs marked as Group Camps. (OGC) Clover Point is about 8 miles from Highway 42.

Registration: Plan to arrive between 5 and 6:30. Check in at administration building. You will be given your cabin assignment and directions as to where to park. You will make name tags and have a chance to tour the camp, have a light supper and join your fellow campers in fun and games.
