1. Set of three rabbits of any meat-type breed, or cross weighing 3 to 5 lbs. each, and matched as closely as possible.
  2. Rabbits show at 6 p.m. Thursday for the sale.
  3. Only two top pens eligible to sell. Must have earned blue ribbon.
  4. Show is open to all Missouri youth. Sale is limited to Dallas County residents and property owners, or students enrolled in Dallas County R-1, Skyline, Macks Creek, Conway, Lebanon, Marshfield, Pleasant Hope, Halfway or Fair Grove School Districts and home schooled or private schooled youth in these areas.

### DEPARTMENT H: HORSE SHOW

Chairman: Nancy McCowan • (417)-299-1101  
Saturday, June 24 at 4 p.m. • In place by 3 p.m.

1. All horses must have current Coggins test.
2. Open to any youth ages 6-21.
3. Exhibitors must manage all horses shown beginning no later than May 1 of current year. Horses shall not receive professional training, showing, or handling after May 1 of current year.
4. All exhibitors must wear their numbers on their backs.
5. An exhibitor may show only once in each class.
6. Each exhibitor must have an adult supervisor or parent on the grounds at all times.
7. Horses are not to be ridden in any area that is not designated.
8. No stallions over six (6) months of age will be allowed.
9. Horses known to kick should have a red ribbon tied in their tail. Unruly or out-of-control horses may be dismissed at the chairman or judge's discretion.
10. No mares with foal at side or wet mares will be allowed.
11. No horses under 6 months old.
12. No stalls will be available for the horses.
13. Appropriate show attire (western or English) is required in all classes.
14. All exhibitors must show in a halter class to be eligible for the showmanship classes.

### Showmanship Rules

1. Showmanship at halter will follow AQHA rules.
2. Showmanship class shall be judged strictly on the exhibitor's ability to fit and show a horse at halter.
3. Showmanship pattern will be posted prior to the class.
4. The use of any type of artificial aid including, but not limited to lighteners, hay, dirt, sharp pins, etc., will be considered a disqualification.

4. Show is open to all Missouri youth. Sale is limited to Dallas County residents and property owners, or students enrolled in Dallas County R-1, Skyline, Macks Creek, Conway, Lebanon, Marshfield, Pleasant Hope, Halfway or Fair Grove School Districts and home schooled or private schooled youth in these areas.

- Thursday, June 22, Show starts at 4 p.m. Sale follows swine show. Animals must be in place by noon. Market sale will be in the following order: Market hogs, market lambs, market steers, meat goats, rabbits and broilers (poultry). -Subject to change-
1. Sale order in each species will be determined by final placing.
  2. If an extreme emergency circumstance forces an exhibitor to arrive past weigh-in on show day, call (417) 345-7184, (417) 733-5427.
  3. All animals floored are no longer owned by the exhibitor. No private treaty sales. Sales of all species are terminal. All animals eligible to sell must sell.
  4. Animals will have been weighed and tagged at spring weigh-in and reweighed on show day.
  5. Exhibitors must meet age requirements for each species to show and sell. Minimum age for barrows is 5; Market lambs/meat goats, 5; Steers, 8; Rabbits/Broilers, 5.
  6. Deductions from sale proceeds: a. 3% commission; b. all federal mandated deductions, such as beef check off, hog check off, etc.; c. sonogram fees for steers, barrows, lambs and meat goats.
  7. Rate of Gain class is determined by the rate of gain and is independent of any and all other criteria.
  8. Show is open to all Missouri youth. Sale is limited to Dallas County residents and property owners, or students enrolled in Dallas County R-1, Skyline, Macks Creek, Conway, Lebanon, Marshfield, Pleasant Hope, Halfway or Fair Grove School Districts and home schooled or private schooled youth in these areas.
  9. If a gilt is weighed in as market hog, she cannot show as breeding stock.

### Market Steer Sale Rules

1. Limit 2 steers at weigh-in, only one may show and sell.
2. Classes may be divided by weight at superintendents or judge's discretion.
3. Minimum weight of 1,000 pounds.
4. There is a show only class for underweight steers.
5. Final placings will be determined by 1/3 on foot; 1/3 carcass quality; 1/3 rate of gain.

### Market Meat Goat Sale Rules

1. Wether or nanny, but nanny cannot be shown as breeding stock, purebred or crossbred, to show and sell.
2. Limit of 2 goats; two may show, only one may sell.
3. Slick shorn and in possession of full set of milk teeth on sale day.
4. Classes may be divided by weight at superintendent's and/or judge's discretion.
5. Lightweight class, under 45 lbs., may SHOW ONLY.
6. Animals must be dehorned or have horns tipped.
7. Show day weight with ultrasound will give carcass results.
8. Final placings will be determined by 1/3 on foot; 1/3 carcass quality; 1/3 rate of gain.

3. Slick sheared, possessing full set of lamb teeth at sale weigh-in.
4. Classes may be divided by weight at superintendent's and/or judge's discretion.
5. Final placings will be determined by 1/3 on foot; 1/3 carcass; and 1/3 rate of gain.

2. Market hogs will be divided by weight into two or more classes on day of show.
3. Market hogs must have been tagged and weighed at designated spring weigh-in for gain competition.
4. All market hogs eligible

5. Market hogs under 220 will show only.
6. Overall champion will be determined by: (a) rate of gain, (b) carcass quality, and (c) on foot placing. Each category counts for one-third of score. Sonoray will be used to determine carcass quality.
