Lot 3 – Beef

Entries are due June 15, 2009. Pre-entry is required; classes will be made prior to the show. **Please state breed on the entry form.** If other breeds are entered in addition to the breeds listed below, additional classes will be added. All Beef classes will be made according to the following guidelines:

- Each breed will be shown as a separate class as long as three or more animals of the breed are entered and in attendance at the 4-H fair. If two or less animals of the breed are entered and in attendance, then that breed will show in the All Other Breeds (AOB) class.
- If a registered animal is 75 or higher percentage of a breed, this will justify for that animal to show as a purebred with the breed. Otherwise, percentage bred, registered cattle not meeting 75% requirement would show in the AOB class. For example, a registered animal that was 75% Limousin and 25% Angus would qualify to show as a purebred Limousin. Mark entry forms accordingly with the correct class and breed.
- Non-registered breeding cattle show in the Commercial Class.
- Show order will be determined by the number of entries per breed – smallest number of entries to largest. Show order will be announced on show day.

Bucket Calf (Beef) – Bucket Calf will be the first class to show.

Beef animals, either sex and any beef breed, will be shown together. Exhibitors must be 8-12 years of age by January 1, 2009.

Beef Bucket Calves, born after January 1, 2009.

I. General Rules

- a. Each cat must have the following vaccinations up to date: rabies and feline leukemia; or will face disqualification. Certificate from a veterinarian is required.
- b. Cats must be free from worms, communicable diseases and fleas.
- c. Cats in heat are disqualified.
- d. After the show, cats must either be taken home or confined. Tying is not enough. Bring a crate or cage.
- e. Cats must be confined as required during show classes.
- f. Extra points if cat is spayed or neutered.
