Description of Projects

Bobby Calf (4-H Only)

The Bobby Calf project is designed for 4-H members ages 8-12 (as of January 1). Requirements are as follows:

1. Own a calf born between February 1 and May 1 of the current year
2. Calf must be owned and fed on a bottle before the calf is two weeks of age. The calf can't nurse a cow after the calf is two weeks old.
3. Members must take care of the calf. Care is to include feeding, training calf to lead, keeping expense records and looking after the calf's health.
4. The Bobby Calf will not be eligible for the steer sale or to show in any other class in the livestock show.
5. The calf can be beef, dairy, or a cross of beef and dairy; steer or heifer.

NO BULLS

For safety reasons bulls will be disqualified from the Small Animal Show – NO EXCEPTIONS

6. Bring your calf to the show.
7. See beef health requirements

Hatching Chicks (4-H Only - 12 years of age & under)

The Hatching Chicks project is designed for 4-H members as an introductory project to poultry. Requirements are as follows:

1. Enroll in the project by January 1
2. Rent an incubator and purchase a dozen pre-set eggs. Both of these are available through the Extension Center at a cost of \$20.00. You must contact the Extension Center by **May 15** to reserve both.
3. Take the incubator home and learn to operate it.
4. Pick up fertile eggs at the Extension Center.

5. Care for eggs and hatch the chicks
6. No hen and chicks, must use incubator
7. Feed and care for the chicks until the Small Animal Show.
8. Keep a record to indicate the cost and amount of feed, other costs of the project, and what you did with the project. Bring these records and chickens to the Small Animal Show.

Small Animal Safety Policies:

- No wildlife allowed – follow Department of Conservation rules as specified in the Wildlife Code of Missouri
- All animals must be caged, leashed, and/or contained as appropriate and manageable by the child during Clover Kids meetings and events.
- Parent and guardian must be present with their child(ren) when animals are involved.

This show is non-competitive. Each participant will receive a participation award and premium money. Clover Kid exhibits are not eligible to compete for trophies given for species champions.

MEMBERS ARE EXPECTED TO FOLLOW ALL GUIDELINES FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE PROJECT OR DISQUALIFICATION MAY RESULT.

Members entering exhibits in the Small Animal Show will receive a ribbon (blue, red or white according to the Danish system) and prize money. Trophies will be awarded to Johnson County classes only. Cats and Dogs **MUST** have documentation of vaccinations – NO PAPERS, NO SHOW!

Show classes will be as follows:

- 01 Bobby Calf (**12 years of age & under**)
- 02 Dog Obedience Pre-Novice, Youth ages 8-11
- 03 Dog Obedience Pre-Novice, Youth ages 12 & up
- 04 Dog Obedience Novice, Youth ages 8-11
- 05 Dog Obedience Novice, Youth ages 12 & up
- 06 Cat
- 07 Hatching Chicks (**12 years of age & under**)
- 08 Miscellaneous Animals (amphibians, hamsters, etc.)

SALE OF MEAT ANIMALS

Johnson County members participating in the Poultry Show and/or Rabbit Show classes at the Small Animal Show have the opportunity to offer meat animals for sale at the Johnson County Junior Livestock Sale. Sale information is described under the Livestock Show sections. In order for meat pens to be eligible for sale, animals must be of a meat breed and must be market ready, following the weight or age guidelines as listed in the show classes. The Small Animal Committee will make the final decision on questions regarding sale eligibility. Show classes are listed as follows.

The Johnson County 4-H Rabbit Show will begin at 1:00 pm.

Pre-registration is required. Pre-registration forms can be found in the back of this book. Additional forms are available at the University Extension Center and must be returned by **June 29**. Entries open to 4-H or FFA youth who are members in good standing with their respective organizations. FFA members must have included rabbits as part of their S.A.E. program. 4-H members must be enrolled in a rabbit project. Rabbits shall have been the **property of the 4-H or FFA member on or before June 1**.

Class numbers for all breeds will be the same. No more than two rabbits per breed per class may be entered. When entering rabbits, specify the breed as Purebred, Crossbred, or Meat pen. Exhibitors must provide cages. Rabbit classes may be broken by breed as needed the day of show.

Johnson County Premiums will be available at the Johnson County Extension Center by August 1, 2009.

Poultry Show Classes Rules

Pre-registration is required. Pre-registration forms can be found in the back of this book. Additional forms are available from the University Extension Center and must be returned by **June 29**. No late registrations accepted. Pre-registration is necessary to ensure adequate poultry testing is available the day of the show.

The American Standards of Perfection issued by the American Poultry Association is the only acceptable standard used in the judging of poultry exhibits. Exhibitors are encouraged to exhibit poultry that meets the requirements for recognized standard breeds and varieties as listed in the

Standard of Perfection. Non-standard poultry may be exhibited and will be judged together as one breed.

Exhibitor is required to furnish their own coop with hinged door. The exhibitor is responsible for care of his/her own birds during the fair. No more than two exhibits per broken class may be entered, except meat pens may have one exhibit per class. Exhibitors are limited to one pen of poultry for the sale. Exhibits must receive a blue or red ribbon to be eligible to sell. An official tester will be available at the show to satisfy the health requirements. Poultry and fowl classes will be broken by breed, sex and age/old (over 1 year) young (under 1 year) as needed the day of the show. For example exhibitor may show no more than 8 birds of the same breed, 2 birds in each of the age division class break down (old male, young male, young female & old female)
