**Exhibits must be the work of the students enrolled in Agriculture and FFA.** The exhibits should be part of the students Supervised Agricultural Experience or a product of their classroom work.



### **FFA ENTOMOLOGY and BEEKEEPING**

1. Exhibits of entomology collections should be properly mounted, labeled, and categorized.

### **FFA FIELD CROPS**

1. **Limit 3 entries per class.**
2. Grains must be in a non-breakable container.
3. Hay must be tied in a crisscross manner.

Wood or metal projects built by the exhibitor in Agriculture class or as part of their SAE. Determine size by referencing the State Fair FFA guidelines.

1. **Limit of 3 exhibits of different variety per class.**
2. Arrangements may include fresh, dried or silk flowers.
