All 4-H members in beef, sheep, swine, rabbits, goats, dairy, and poultry must have a valid Show Me Quality Assurance Card by June 1<sup>st</sup> to be a member in good standing and to show at the County or State Fair.

Members 8-13 must take the MSQA training two consecutive years and once again when they turn 14. Members 14 and older must take the program once. The Macon County MSQA training will be held May 6<sup>th</sup> at the Extension Office starting at 6:00 p.m. Linn County will also be holding one March 30<sup>th</sup> at the Linn County Fairgrounds at 6:00 p.m. and Randolph County March 31<sup>st</sup> at the Youth Cabin in Rothwell Park at 6:00 p.m. If you have questions about this program give the Extension Office a call.

### **ATTENTION ALL MACON COUNTY 4-H HORSE MEMBERS**

## **TEEN COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM**

In the case of a wide spread disaster, professional emergency personnel will not be able to respond to every citizen's needs. Teens and their family, friends, and neighbors may need to fend for themselves for a significant period of time.

How can you learn the skills that will be needed before, during and after a disaster? Take Teen CERT Training! This class covers basic, critical skills needed to prepare for and protect yourself, your family, your friends, and your community in the event of a disaster.

Participate in this program and you will learn all the skills taught in the federal CERT program, be introduced to many career opportunities within the emergency response field, and help your community prepare for a disaster.

The program includes:

- Disasters, Disaster Preparedness and Mitigation
- Light Search and Rescue
- Disaster First-Aid
- Emotional First-Aid
- Disaster Teamwork
- Disaster Communications
- Animals in Disasters

This program will be held at Pinecrest Camp in Fredericktown and Mark Twain State Park in Stoutsville on April 3-5 cost is \$100 (cost includes all meals, lodging and training materials. Scholarships given to military dependents). Two other training will be at the Boys and Girls Club in Independence and Springfield's Boys and Girls Club on April 17-19 cost is \$75 (Cost includes all meals dormitory style lodging training materials. ## **STATE FARM YOUTH ADVISORY BOARD APPLICATIONS AVAILABLE**

Applications are now available for the State Farm Youth Advisory Board. The State Farm Youth Advisory Board is one of the nations' most exciting opportunities for youth empowerment and development. The board is comprised of a diverse group of 30 young people, ages 17-20, chosen from each of 12 U.S. State Farm zones which cover all states within the United States, and one State Farm Canadian zone (Alberta, New Brunswick, or Ontario provinces only). Three at-large members are nominated by State Farm's national service-learning partners. Scholarships are provided to Youth Advisory Board members.

Members of this Board play an important leadership role in creating and overseeing a \$5 million a year signature service-learning initiative which addresses pressing issues of importance to youth, State Farm, and communities across North America. The Youth Board collectively helps identify these issues; develops the grant making processes for catalyzing large-scale, student-driven service-learning projects that systemically address the issues; selects the programs to receive grants; provides technical assistance and oversight to site grantees; and assists with the communications and outreach of the initiative. The Youth Board interacts with senior State Farm leaders in presenting and defending an analysis of their grant-making decisions. Application must be postmarked March 31, 2009. ## **KOHL'S KIDS WHO CARE SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO RECOGNIZE YOUNG VOLUNTEERS**

Through the Kohl's Kids Who Care scholarship program, the Kohl's Corporation <http://www.kohlscorporation.com/> plans to award a total of over \$350,000 in scholarships and prizes this year to more than two thousand kids whose volunteer efforts have made a positive impact on their communities. The program recognizes and rewards young volunteers (ages 6 to 18) who help make their communities a better place.

To be eligible for an award, the young person's efforts should be above and beyond what is normally expected of a child his or her age. Volunteer efforts should have made a positive impact on others and occurred in the last twelve months. The activity cannot be performed solely to benefit a family member. Creativity, initiative, generosity, leadership, and project reach will be evaluated during the judging process.

Nominees must be legal U.S. residents of a state in which a Kohl's store is located. Nominees must be between the ages of 6 and 18 and not yet a high school graduate as of March 15, 2009. Each nominee must be nominated by someone 21 years of age or older. Parents may nominate their own children.

Nominees will be divided into two groups (ages 6 to 12 and 13 to 18) and awards will be given on three levels. More than two thousand store winners will each be awarded a \$50 Kohl's Gift Card. The 194 regional winners will each be awarded \$1,000 scholarships toward their postsecondary education. Ten national winners will each be awarded \$5,000 scholarships. ## **BEEF CATTLE SHOWING AND FITTING CLINIC**

Junior beef cattle exhibitors interested in learning about Beef Cattle Showing and Fitting may want to attend this Clinic held in Kirksville Missouri on March 13-15, 2009 at the NEMO Fairgrounds. The clinic will not only cover fitting and showing but will include topics on daily care, feeding, and other important information pertinent to showing beef cattle.

The lead instructor for the clinic will be Chuck McCullough from Allerton, Iowa. Chuck is a nationally recognized beef cattle fitter. He will be assisted by others so that individual instructional help can be optimized. The clinic is co-sponsored by University of Missouri Extension and the Wahl Clipper Corporation. Clinic participants will need to bring their show calf and equipment, including blocking chute, show stick, blower, comb, brushes, adhesives, and clippers. If enrollees do not have all of this equipment there will be extra equipment available and show supplies available for purchase during the clinic.

## **WILDLIFE HABITAT MANAGEMENT STATE CONTEST**

Saturday April 4, Hickory Hill Camp, Columbia, MO

All 4-Hers are eligible to participate in the state Wildlife Judging event as an individual or as a team member. Awards will be presented in two age divisions: Junior, age 8-13 and Senior, age 14-18. Senior teams compete for a chance to participate in the national contest to be held July 19-23 near Zwolle, Louisiana. This year's state contest will focus on the 16 featured wildlife species of the Eastern Deciduous Forest Region and the appropriate wildlife management practices. ## **4-H MOVE ACROSS MISSOURI CONTEST**

### **New physical activity program!**

4-H Move Across Missouri (MOVE) promotes physical activity by encouraging youth and families to engage in activities they enjoy such as walking, biking, running, swimming, dance, taekwondo, gardening and more.

### Monthly MOVEment Activity Idea

Youth, families, clubs, afterschool groups and others can have fun while being physically active!

### Balloon Soccer

Materials - 10-inch round balloon

This activity can be played outdoors or indoors in a wide-open room. Youth stand in a circle shoulder to shoulder, holding hands. Youth kick the balloon around the circle passing to each player in the circle. After the balloon has been kicked around the circle, ask everyone to take a giant step back and kick the balloon around again (hands may need to be dropped). Keep playing until you run out of space! Encourage youth to try kicking with the other leg in the opposite direction or pass the balloon by bouncing it off their head.

### **CHALLENGE: 4-H MILLION TREE PROJECT**

MU Extension 4-H'ers have been challenged to be part of 4-H Million Trees, a service project started by a 4-H member in California who decided to do something to combat global climate change. Missouri's goal is to plant at least 22,000 new trees throughout the state to help improve the quality of the environment. The next few months are a perfect time to plant, so start planning now. Go to [4h.missouri.edu](http://4h.missouri.edu) for resources on the correct type of tree for the planting location. Get your seedlings, available for free to MU Extension 4-H'ers, from the Missouri Department of Conservation. Larger trees also are available through the Missouri ReLeaf program. Most importantly, be sure to register your project at [www.4hmilliontrees.org](http://www.4hmilliontrees.org) to make sure your trees count toward the goal. Will you accept the challenge?

## **CLOVER KIDS CORNER**

Through Clover Kids clubs, children learn how to get along, share, and work in groups, explore their interests, and build self-confidence. Each Clover Kids Corner provides an activity, information or other materials that Clover Kids leaders can use in planning and implementing experiences that introduce five to seven-year olds to the 4-H concept of learning by doing.

### **Making Kazoos**

#### **What you need:**

Empty toilet paper rolls  
Rubber bands  
Wax paper  
Markers  
Gummed stars

#### **What you do:**

Show the children how to assemble their own kazoos by folding the wax paper several times so that it covers the end of the paper roll. Rubber band it in place. Encourage the children to decorate their kazoos with the markers and stars. Test the kazoos. Place the end of the roll lightly to your mouth and sing or hum. The vibration of the layers of wax paper should make your kazoos sound great!

## **CLUB LEADER TIPS**

1. Encourage all members to keep records for awards that will be available at year end.
2. Be sure all project groups are functioning.
3. Discuss/approve spring and summer service projects as proposed by the committee. Apply for MO 4-H Foundation Community Service Grants, if needed.
4. Discuss upcoming contests, shows, and fairs.
5. Continue to encourage families to read and save the 4-H family newsletter.
6. Remind high school seniors of MO 4-H Foundation Scholarship applications that are due in state office by April 1.
7. Reminder: One safety program and one health program should be given at a club meeting each year.

## **PROJECT LEADER TIPS**

### **What other activities can be added to the project group?**

In addition to taking part in the regular project meeting, members can participate by:

- Planning and carrying out project events such as field trips, tours, special exhibits, events for parents, etc.
- Giving demonstrations or judging and exhibiting at local, county or area 4-H Achievement Day.
- Community service activities
- Skill-a-thons
- Judging Classes
