- Sept. 4: **Orientation, Plants & the Environment** - Introduction to the Master Gardener program and introduction to plants
- Sept. 11: **Soils and Composting** - Soil composition, soil testing, soil fertility and fertilizers, growing media, organic fertilizers
- Sept. 18: **Woody Ornamentals & Pruning** - Planting and maintaining woody ornamental plants, including pruning
- Sept. 25: **Turf** - Lawn care, grass species & varieties for Missouri lawns, controlling lawn weeds and pests
- Oct. 2: **Plant Health** - Plant diseases & pesticide safety
- Oct. 9: **Herbaceous Ornamentals** - Annual ornamental plants and non-woody perennial ornamental plants
- Oct. 16: **Plant Propagation** - Methods of plant propagation
- Oct. 23: **Vegetables** - Vegetable gardening
- Oct. 30: **Insects** - Home and garden insect identification and control
- Nov. 6: **Fruit Production** - Growing apples, peaches, pears, grapes, and other fruits in Missouri
- Nov. 13: **Resources, Questions, and Graduation**
