1. All entries must have been grown by the exhibitor as a part of his/her supervised occupational experience program. All samples must have been produced during the year specified for the class. The exhibitor shall keep records of such entries in the approved Missouri Farm Business Record Book and report such enterprises on the departmental VA-3 (Report of the Students SAE Program) and have on file validation forms with the schools' departmental records.
2. Each sample must contain a label showing exhibitor's name, chapter, kind of crop, variety, and class number entered in.
3. Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries in each class in all the field crops classes and all the horticulture classes. Limit of four (4) in the Lot.
