

Endowment Overview

Missouri 4-H Foundation

Over the years, growth of our endowment through investment returns and donations has enabled us to fulfill our mission to empower tomorrow's leaders by funding meaningful experiences today. As of June 30, 2023, the Missouri 4-H Foundation's endowment was comprised of 95 individual funds totaling approximately \$9.77 million.





Performance

The Missouri 4-H Foundation seeks to achieve an annualized rate of return of at least 5.0% net of fees to fund spending and allow for growth of the endowment after considering the effects of inflation. The benchmark is applied over the long term due to the volatility of short-term periods.


Additional long-term benchmarks are composites of the following indexes:


- Benchmark A: 45% S&P 1500; 15% MSCI All Country World ex U.S. Index; 35% Bloomberg Barclays Intermediate Govt./Credit Index; 5% 90-Day T-Bill.
- Benchmark B: Median performance of foundations and endowments under \$50 million.
- Benchmark C: 60% MSCI All Country World Index;
 40% Bloomberg Barclays U.S. Aggregate Index.

Spending

The Missouri 4-H Foundation employs spending, and investment policies designed to provide a predictable and stable stream of income to support Missouri 4-H while ensuring the real value of the endowment does not decline over time. The spending policy is approved by the Board of Trustees and includes two types of funds:

- Endowed Funds: Endowed funds include board designated (unrestricted) and donor restricted funds. Authorized expenditures during the foundation's fiscal year shall be no less than 4% and no more than 6% of the average fair market value of the endowment for the trailing three-year period ending December 31.
- Non-Endowed Funds: Quasi-restricted funds are non-endowed, however, they are long-term investments and are expected to remain intact for a minimum of five years, after which the income and principal may be spent.
