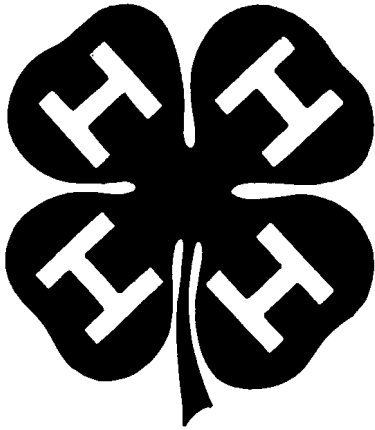

UPDATESEnrollments

Club leaders PLEASE check all enrollment forms and make sure they are complete and correct. We will not fill out the forms for you. Members should be made aware that in order to exhibit a project at the fair they must be enrolled in the project. Enrollment changes can be made until December 31. Remember to include the "Requirements Form". Also, new leaders cannot begin until they have cleared the screening process. All approved leaders should receive a postcard.

Shooting Sports

In order for members to enroll in a phase of Shooting Sports, a 4-H certified leader must be identified. An adult must complete the 4-H Certification Program before he/she can lead the project. Kids must be enrolled in Shooting Sports Safety if they have never taken a shooting sports project or have completed the Missouri Department of Conservation Hunter Education course.
