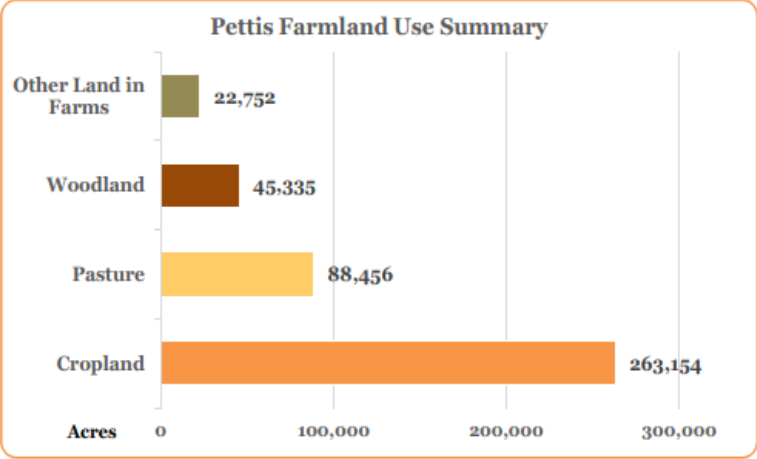

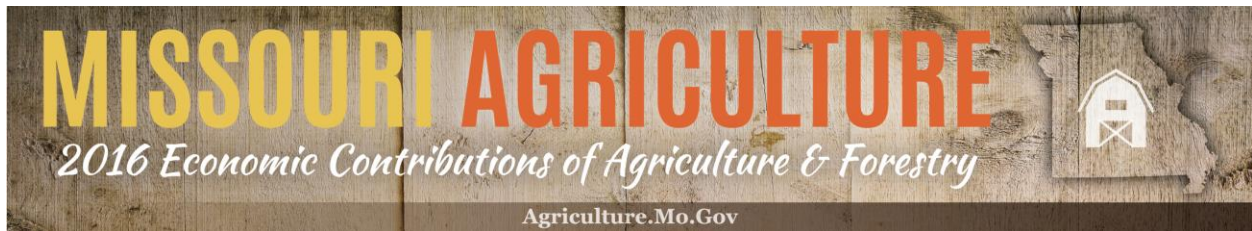

**Sales:** The broadest measure of economic activity - often referred to as "output"; **Employment (Jobs):** A measure of job positions without regard to whether they are full-time equivalents; **Value-Added:** Sales (output) minus the cost of inputs; **Taxes:** Includes taxes paid at the federal, state and local levels.

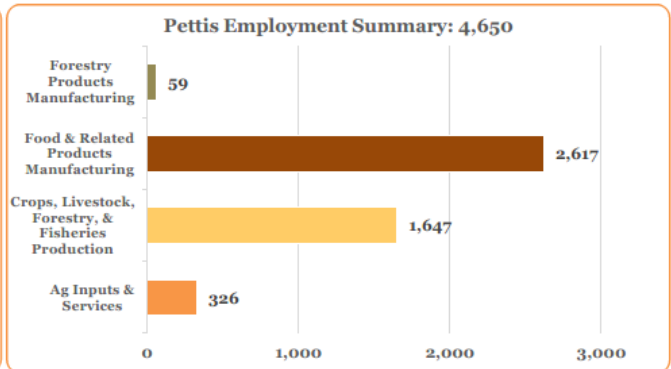
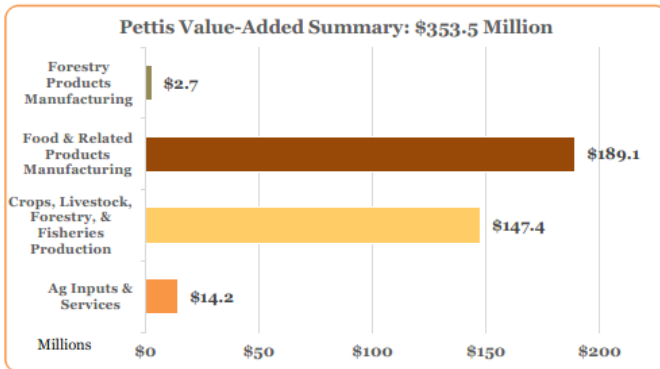

### Overall Contributions to Pettis County

Agricultural, forestry, and related industries support 4,650 jobs in Pettis County. Additionally, these industries contribute \$1.2 billion in sales, which translates to \$353.5 million in added value to the area after \$797.7 million worth of inputs are purchased. Of this \$353.5 million, \$208.2 million is comprised of labor income. Tax revenues generated by the agricultural, forestry, and related industries in Pettis County are \$58.8 million.
