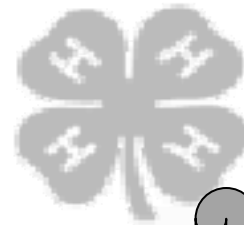

Camp Counselor Camp & 4-H Camp

For those members 14 years of age and older as of January 1 who would like to be a Counselor at the 2007 4-H Camp, applications are now available in the Extension office. 4-H Camp applications are now available in the Extension Office for members ages 8 through 13 . June 5-7 is Counselor training and June 11-14 is 4-H Camp.

The Cost of Camp Counselor Camp is \$97.00 (plus \$24.00 for round trip bus transportation from Edina or Kirksville to camp) **\$97.00 + \$24.00 bus = \$121.00 Due May 1.** Transportation is on your own for Counselor Camp. Camp Counselor Forms are due May 1 at the Knox County Extension Office. They will not be counted until they are in the office. **Phone interviews of applicants will be May 15.** Both camps are at Cuivre River State Park, Camp Derricotte, Troy, Missouri. Counselors must attend both camps. Camp Counselors serve as a positive role model for 4-H Campers age 8-13. They lead games, activities, and manage small groups of youth. They also listen, share, guide and teach campers.

4-H Camp forms and fees are due in at the Knox County Extension office before May 15. Camp fees are **\$56.00 + \$24.00 bus = \$80.00.** **Registrations received after the 15th will be charged an additional \$20.** 4-H camp helps members develop social and teamwork skills. Camp also helps prepare members to learn to learn and develops skills in self responsibility. Applications are available at the Schuyler County Extension Office. 660-457-3469.

A DEFINITION OF WESTERN STOCK AND NON-STOCK (SADDLE) HORSES HAS BEEN ADDED TO THE 4-H WEB PAGE HORSE MANUAL SAMPLE SHOW GUIDELINES

Exhibitors should show their horse in the most appropriate division for their breed or type of horse. These divisions should take into consideration the breed differences in head carriage and animation. Stock-type horses will have a lowered natural head carriage with flat knee action for the jog and lope. Stock-type includes Quarter Horse, Appaloosa, Buckskin, Palomino, and Paint. Non-stock (Saddle) type horses will have a natural high head carriage with breaking knee action in the trot and canter. Non-stock (Saddle) type includes American Saddlebred, American Show Horse, Arabian, Morgan and Thoroughbred. Exhibitors showing mixed breed horses should select the division most closely fitting the horse's head carriage and animation. It is in the exhibitor's best interest to enter the appropriate division.

Club Lamb and Meat Goat Management and Show Camp and Club Pig Management and Show Camp Management and Show Camps are being offered for Club Lambs, Meat Goats and Club Pigs at the NEMO fairgrounds in Kirksville, Missouri on June 9. Enrollment is \$10.00 per person and is limited to the first 30 enrollees per species (30 for Club Lambs, 30 for Meat Goats, and 30 for Club pigs). Enrollment is due by May 18 and a minimum of 20 enrollees will be required for each session or the camp will be canceled and the enrollment fee refunded.

The camps will start at 9:30 a.m. and conclude at 5:00 p.m. Included in the program will be lectures, demonstrations, and some hands-on experiences. Enrollees are not to bring their own animals. Animals will be available at the camp. This is an excellent way to have your project meetings. June 26-28, 2007

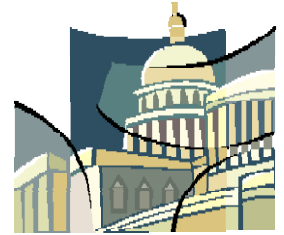

ANIMAL HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR EXHIBITION 2007

There is one MAJOR change in the sheep and goat regulations. Wethers (castrated males) NOW have to have official ID or tattoo and health paper like all other sheep have to have, and have had in the past. Please be sure market lamb and goat (wether) owners know about the ID or tattoo and health paper change. All members interested in showing animals need to take responsibility for reviewing the section of the [rules](#) related to the species they show. These are not just State Fair rules they are Missouri Department of Agriculture Rules for Exhibition and are required.

PREMISE I D NOT REQUIRED AT 2007 STATE FAIR

Exhibitors at the 2007 Missouri State Fair will not be required to provide a premise ID number. Space will be provided on entry forms to include the ID number if they have chosen to participate in the program, but no exhibitor will be required to do so.
