THIS IS A FIT OPTIONAL SHOW.

IF YOU CHOOSE TO FIT,
THE FOLLOWING RULES APPLY:

**Only 4-H/FFA members, immediate family or project leader may help fit the animal. (No outside or hired fitters.)

**NO PAINT above the hocks. Adhesives can be used from hock down and tail head ONLY.

**All cattle must be fit inside the barns or in the grass area between the barns. (No exceptions!)

Steers will be shown by weight and breed

- 1. All steers & market heifers must be weighed in for show. Only one official weigh-in.
- 2. All steers & market heifers must be dehorned and be born after 1-1-19.

- Steers & market heifers must be brought in at 3:00 on. Thursday, July 9 for weighin at the Fairgrounds.
- 4. Breeding animals and bobby calves must be in place by 3:30 p.m..
- 5. All animals will be released immediately following show.
- 6. Show schedule is as follows on Thursday, July 9, starting at 5:00 p.m.:
 - BOBBY CALVES & BOBBY CALF SHOWMANSHIP
 - JUNIOR BREEDING CLASSES
 - MARKET SHOW
 - SHOWMANSHIP (SENIOR, INTERMEDIATE, JUNIOR)
 - GROUP CLASSES

STEER SHOW/ MARKET HEIFER Show WILL BEGIN IMMEDIATELY FOLLWING THE BREEDING SHOW. Market Heifers will show with the steers in class; there will NOT be a separate show.

- If any animal appears to be wild or unruly, the chairman may disqualify and/ or dismiss the entry.
- 8. Any Bates County exhibitor wishing to show a steer or market heifer at the fair must have weighed in the animals at spring weigh-in. Only those animals weighed at spring weigh-in are eligible for exhibition at the fair. No substitutions. Spring weigh-in is limited to two market beef animals per exhibitor.

Class numbers will be the same for all breeds except a letter will be added to each class to designate the breed as follows: Angus-A; Charloais-C; Santa Gertrudis-G; Hereford-H; Chianina-K; Limousin-L; Maine Anjou-M; Shorthorn-S; Simmental-T; Crossbred-X; Pinz-P; Brangus-B; Gelbvieh-GE; American Bred-AB; Salers- SA; Braunvieh-BV. (Example: An Angus Senior heifer will be Class 33A; a Hereford steer will be Class 11H.)



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Steers entered in breed classes must have registration papers or a breeder certificate to be in breed classes. An animal must be eligible for registration according to that breed association's rules or be shown as a Crossbred-X. All breeding heifers must have registered papers to show by breed or be shown as a Crossbred-X.

Showmanship ages are as follows: Junior-8-10 years; Intermediate-11-14 years; Senior-15 years & up. (Age as of January 1, 2020)

Class Numbers:

- 11. Market Steer/Heifer
- 15. Bobby Calf, any breed of calf born February 1 to April 1, 2020, that has been HAND FED since the calf was 2 WEEKS of age; calf may NOT be shown in any other breeding class at the Fair. Bobby calves project will be limited to first- and second-year beef or dairy projects; a showmanship class will be offered for bobby calves during their regular class. Bobby calf exhibitors may choose to enter bobby calf showmanship showmanship regular (junior, or intermediate or senior) but **not** both.
- 30. Spring heifer calved after January 1, 2020
- 31. Winter heifer calved November December 2019
- Senior heifer calved September October 2019
- 33. Late summer heifer calved July August 2019
- 34. Early summer heifer calved May June 2019
- 35. Spring yearling heifer calved March April 2019
- 36. Junior yearling heifer calved January February 2019
- 37. Senior yearling heifer calved September– December 2018
- 38. Bred heifers calved January August 2018
- 39. Adult cow-calf pair
- 40. Spring bull calved after Jan. 1, 2020

- 41. Winter Bull, Nov.-Dec. 2019
- 42. Senior Bull, Sept. Oct. 2019
- 43. Late Summer Bull, July Aug. 2019
- 44. Early Summer Bull, May June, 2019
- 45. Spring Yearling Bull, March April, 2019
- 46. Junior Yearling Bull, Jan. Feb. 2019

A supreme champion and reserve female will be chosen from among the breed champions.

Club herd is a TOTAL of 4 head. Must have two males and two females and no exhibitor shall own more than two of the animals making up the herd. All animals must be shown in other classes. Any or all beef breeds may be represented. Clubs have no limit to number of herds that can be shown.

51. Beef bred and owned class: Bates County youth only. Projects in this class must have been born and raised on the home farm. A purchased female must have been owned by exhibitor at time of service for its calves to be eligible for this class. Calves resulting from the *purchase of embryos* will **NOT** be eligible.

51A. Bred and owned female 51B. Bred and owned market

There will be a check of registration papers and or proper certification from the breed associations. The papers need to be in the exhibitor name. Each animal can have more than one owner on the paper work, but the exhibitor must be one of them. If the exhibitor does not have proper paper work from the association, then it will be shown in the x-breed category. Animals cannot be stalled in the south barn attached to the show ring.

There will be an exhibitor meeting at after check-in to go over rules and tie outs.



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If there are less than 3 animals per breed for a division, those animals will show in a class together.

NO GROOMING chutes allowed in the allies or walkways of the barns. They can be placed in extra stalls if available, or in the grass section between the show ring and the cattle barn. NO EXCEPTIONS.

ALL bedding must be removed OUT OF THE BARNS to the designated area and NOT left in the alley way before you leave or you will NOT receive your premium.
