Veterans Committee

The veterans committee is happy to announce that the Veterans Farm is becoming a reality pm. There was a ribbon cutting on Veterans Day, November 11 at the former site of the CCUA Urban Farm. This site will now be known as the Mark and Carol Stevenson Veterans Urban Farm. Mark and Carol Stevenson are the landowners who have graciously allowed CCUA to garden on their land for 10 years and plan to now allow the veterans to use their land. The 1 1/3 acre plot is located off of College on Smith Street. It snowed the day of the ribbon cutting and was cold but Chris Walker, Michelle Motley, and I braved the weather to attend.

There are several focuses of activity for veterans at the Urban Farm. Veterans who have been inpatients at the Harry S Truman Veterans Hospital will be able to have a compensated work experience to learn basic work habits, social skills and gardening skills. They will be trained and educated on how to grow vegetables and fruit. Another focus will be teaching veterans better health habits. This will be done by doing the physical labor of gardening and learning about nutrition through growing vegetables. The veterans will also learn how to cook nutritious meals at the VA. There will be Veterans with varying levels of physical and mental abilities and social skills.

Master Gardeners have volunteered to work directly with the Veterans. We plan to teach veterans gardening skills by interacting directly with them while gardening. We also may teach classes if there is enough interest. I anticipate this project expanding yearly to the extent we have volunteers for it.

CCUA hopes to hire a veteran as farm manager in January. At that time planning meetings between CCUA, the Veterans administration and interested parties such as Master Gardeners will begin. The work with veterans should begin at the Urban Farm in the spring. I will keep the group posted on opportunities to volunteer.
