Wrapping up the Current 4-H year-

As the 4-H year winds down, there is paperwork to be completed at the end of the year (September 30). It includes the Community Service form and the club audit form from the treasurer.

SEMO District Fair Catalog and Information-

The 2019 SEMO District Fair Catalog is available online. Livestock entries are due **August 8** and can be completed online or via paper copy. Late entries can be made until **August 22nd** with an additional \$50 late fee per animal. 4-H building fair tags will be created online this year, like last year. Details about this will be sent out in August. Entries for building exhibits will open on August 15. It is the same online entry system as last year, which links with 4-H Online. You will log in using your 4-H Online log in information. A help guide is available. The link will be sent out once it is open.

4-H Shooting Sports Leader Certification Workshop-

Fall Shooting Sports Certification will be October 4-6, 2019 at Camp Galilee, El Dorado Springs, MO.

It will run from 7:30 pm on Friday night to 3:15 pm on Sunday. The cost is \$100 - includes 5 meals, overnight lodging and workshop materials. The deadline to sign up is August 31.

Registration is limited and will close when a discipline class reaches maximum number; or when the camp is full. All registrations accepted on a first-come, first-served basis when accompanied by fee. Workshops usually fill up before the deadline, so don't delay! Registration must be done via 4HOnline. Attention High School Students:

Did you know that you could attend Mizzou? MU is a land grant University? Now the Missouri Land Grant may be awarded to all undergraduate Missouri residents* who are full-time Pell Grant eligible and working toward their first undergrad degree. For those eligible, the grant will cover all tuition and fees not covered by other grants or scholarships.



The Missouri Land Grant Honors may be awarded to undergraduate Missouri residents* who are full-time Pell Grant eligible, working toward their first undergrad degree, and who are accepted into the Honors College. To retain eligibility, students must enroll in at least one honors course for each semester enrolled (unless an exception is granted by the Honors College, or if the requirements for an Honors Certificate have already been met).

In addition, it is required that eligible students who enroll at MU for the first time in Fall 2018 or later reside in on campus housing to maintain eligibility for the award. For their first two years of enrollment, students must live in a residence hall designated as the Honors Learning Community, unless otherwise approved by the director of the Honors College. If an eligible student chooses to live off campus at any point, they will no longer be able to receive the Missouri Land Grant Honors, and will instead be eligible for the Missouri Land Grant (see above).

For those eligible, the grant will meet 100 percent of the student's financial need, including tuition, fees, and room and board (maximum may not exceed published estimate for the current academic year: 2017-18 year is \$10,808), that is not covered by other grants and scholarships.

Students who qualify for the Missouri Land Grant Honors will also be asked to complete a financial aid process called [verification](#). Students will be contacted regarding the information that is needed for this process. These students will also be subject to a deadline of August 1st

for submitting all required verification documents.

*A Missouri resident is defined as being classified as a Missouri resident for tuition purposes at the time of initial application to the University of Missouri.

Renewal Criteria

- Can be renewed for up to 10 semesters
- Must maintain full-time Pell Grant eligibility in each term received
- Must meet [Satisfactory Academic Progress](#)

Potato Prints



Supplies:

- Potatoes
- Paint
- Cookie cutters
- Paper
- Knife

Instructions:

1. Cut a large potato in half.

2. You will need a cookie cutter that fits on the potato half. Press the cookie cutter into the flat side of the potato.
3. Using a knife, cut the potato around the outside of the cookie cutter leaving a shaped potato stamp.
4. Have the children dip the potatoes in the paint and press them firmly onto the paper. If the potatoes are not cut evenly the shapes will not appear clearly.
