Grants Available for Fishing Programs-

The Missouri Dept. of Conservation is offering grants to assist high school fishing clubs in providing quality fishing programs. Grants up to \$500 are available to clubs that participate in approved conservation activities, such as kids fishing clinics, fish habitat improvement projects, Stream Team cleanup, special fishing events & others. To apply interested schools or club leaders should submit an online grant application at <https://bit.ly/2RphowQ> highlighting the conservation activity they plan to participate in.

Congressional Award-

The Congressional Award recognizes youth for their community service, physical fitness, personal development (learning) & expedition (exploring or planning a trip). While this is a national award and not specific to 4-H, 4-H youth are doing many things that are part of the award. Youth ages 13 to 24 can apply for the award. Youth need to register for the award before they can start counting their hours. They will need to keep track of their activities & amount of time spent doing them. After they have reached the criteria for bronze,

Youth are also required to complete Show Me Quality Assurance (SMQA).

If you will be exhibiting market swine, lambs, or goats at the SEMO District Fair, you will need to submit a nomination form in order to show and sell. They are due to the Cape County Extension office by **July 15**.

Monarch and Pollinators Mini-grants-

This project provides \$50 mini-grants to 4-H Clubs or members across the state **to plant and maintain monarch habitat gardens on highly visible public properties** such as county courthouses, city parks, fairgrounds, school grounds, highway right-of-ways, etc. 4-H clubs/project leaders/members will be issued \$50 vouchers by the state 4-H office that can be redeemed at GrowNative! plant retailers covering up to ½ of the cost of landscape plantings for each 100 square feet of habitat (~the footprint of a large SUV). Father's Day Keepsake Box-

Materials:

50 popsicle craft sticks

Tacky glue

Glitter glue

Rock

Instructions:

1) Start by gluing four craft sticks together in a square (may need to remind little ones how much glue to use on the ends of the sticks).

2) Continue layering the crafts sticks on top of each other and gluing them into place until the box is as deep as you want it. (Try to save 15 for

the cover and 11 for the bottom if you are sticking to 50 sticks total.)

3) On the last layer, place craft sticks side by side all the way across. This will actually be the bottom once the glue is dry and you flip the box over.

4) Now, to make the cover, start the same way as you did for the box. Glue four sticks in a square. Then lay the sticks across the whole top and let it dry.

5) Next, glue a rock in the middle of the cover. Decorate the cover as you wish.

6) You can give it to Dad already filled with keepsakes, place a different gift inside, or give it to him as is so it can be filled up with memories. This is a fun Father's Day craft for kids to make something to go on Dad's desk at work or on top of the dresser at home.
