THE BOTTOM SECTION OF THE FAIR TAG

We match the number of your “Claim Check” with the number on your entry tag to insure you take home the items you brought to the fair. Because you keep the “Claim Check” part of the tag, **DO NOT WRITE** on the back of the “Claim Check” any project information.

BACK SIDE OF FAIR TAG

Many exhibits require additional information on the back of the entry tag.

The reasoning is the more information given about the project; the easier it is to be judged.

Check the information requested for your project entry. If this information is missing, the entry may be marked down one ribbon level or disqualified for incompleteness.

3. Signs of spoilage or alteration from approved processing guidelines will disqualify exhibit. Information on standard procedure is available from County University Extension Centers.

4. All canned goods are to have ring bands removed.

5. Food preservation entries will not be sampled.
