Upcoming Events

The County Fair, Achievement Day, and Fashion Revue committees have worked to create a booklet explaining the events of the weekend. It is posted on the webpage and your club leaders have a paper copy. An electronic copy was emailed to all 4-H families. Please reference for detailed information.

County Fair

The county fair will be Friday, July 12 and will include **optional** conference judging for exhibits. Conference judging is when a 4-H member discuss their project with a judge. Exhibit tags and fair classes were handed out at the June 4-H Council meeting and are at the Extension office. The county fair is a chance for you to show off your projects, have them judged, earn a little prize money, and see what your fellow 4-H members are doing! Fair Classes are posted on the website and were emailed. Questions on what to enter? Give us a call!

County Achievement Day

Pre-registration forms for demonstrations, public speaking, and personal development will be due **July 1.** These events will take place in the upper level of the extension office on Saturday, July 13. Blue ribbon demonstrations can be given at the Missouri State Fair and blue ribbon public speaking participants are eligible to compete in the State Public Speaking Contest in September. There are no club limits on participation in all events. Times for events will be scheduled.

Clover Kids

Clover Kids are able to participate in all events (demonstrations, personal development, and public speaking)! There is also a special contest just for them – they can recite the 4-H pledge.

Demonstrations are the same as your club demonstration. Scoring for Demonstrations involves the overall appearance of the child: neat and clean, confidence/poise/language: diction, good sentence structure and English, manners, able to think and respond to questions within a reasonable length of time, omits unnecessary words. Foods Demonstrators must wear an apron, have a wet cloth for washing their hands and wiping up spills; clear bowls and other containers that ingredients can be seen through as much as possible; brand names must be covered or removed, etc.

Personal Development is where the youth talk about their experiences in and outside of 4-H. For older youth, it is preparation for a job interview. Scoring for the Personal Development event includes responses to questions, manners, able to think and respond within a reasonable length of time, omits unnecessary words.

Public Speaking has four categories – prepared (written speech), extemporaneous (draw a topic and then prepare a speech within a certain time), technology assisted (similar to prepared only use presentation software), and interpretation (dramatic and humorous). Fashion Revue

Fashion Revue will be held Friday, July 12 in conjunction with the County Fair. This is an opportunity for youth enrolled in clothing, knitting, and crochet to show off their skills. Categories include Clothes You Make, Clothes you Buy, Knit, and Crochet. Youth model their outfit at the Awards Ceremony on Saturday, July 13. The goal of Fashion Revue is to develop an understanding of personal presentation in public situations with regard to clothing, accessories and grooming.

The 12th Annual Show-Me 4-H Wares youth sales booth is back at the Missouri State Fair. 4-H youth ages 11-18 can apply to sell original products or services to fairgoers in the Mizzou Central Building, Aug. 8-18. Showcase your 4-H projects, gain business and marketing skills, earn your own money as an entrepreneur! Sell as an individual, with a biz buddy, or with a team of three members from your club or project group. Each exhibitor is selected for a half-day time slot of your choice on one of six high-traffic sales booth days. (Youth age 10 or younger may assist older members with selling on-site). They are due to the Cape Girardeau County Extension office by **July 15**. Forms are to members enrolled in these projects in April. They are also available online. If you do not receive an email, you are not enrolled in the project and cannot show!

Show Me Quality Assurance (SMQA)

If you will be exhibiting livestock at the SEMO District Fair, you must be SMQA certified. You can complete it online at: http://agebb.missouri.edu/smqa/ or attend an in person training. See flyer for dates and locations. If you are unsure if you need to complete it, call the Extension office. You will not be allowed to show if it is not completed.
