It's Fundraising Time!

The fundraising committee dove in and planned a great online fundraiser. This is a virtual auction/raffle of various items that are donated for the 4-H cause. The funds are used to support youth participation in 4-H events and to support 4-H programming in Cass County. How this auction/raffle works is that donated items are brought to the Extension Office by the 3rd Monday of the month (items needed by Dec. 21st for January virtual auction). Committee takes pictures of auction items and post them on the fundraising Facebook page for viewing and bidding. Bids run from the 1st of the month through the third Monday of the month. When bids close, winners will be announced. Winners have a couple days to pay for items by cash or check and pick up items. If items are not paid for and picked up, items will go back into the next auction round. Donated items will then be due at the Extension Office the 3rd Monday of January for the February auction. February will be a basket auction. The Facebook page to check out the auction is Cass County Missouri 4-H Fundraising. There are some great items for Christmas shoppers! Please share this page with your family, friends, etc. to reach a greater audience to support the fundraiser. Hoping to launch the auction any day now once it is all set and ready to go.

New 4-H Year Enrollment Process

Be sure to get re-enrolled for the 4-H year and remind your 4-H friends. Project meetings may be starting soon so sign up now so you don't miss out. Here are the steps you will need to take to get enrolled. Go to http://v2.4honline.com I have heard that for most families this enrolling process is easier than in the past. From my end there are still kinks that are being worked out of this new version. I thank you for your patience if you have experienced some of the kinks. If you have trouble enrolling please call Janice or Jenny at the Extension Center for assistance. Get enrolled because 4-H has begun for 2020-2021!

- If possible pay by credit card because the enrollment is processed much quicker.
- Volunteers that are new this year or did not submit a background check consent form last year, must do so this year. They are found on the Cass County Extension website under 4-H, Schedule, Forms –October. Look for the Background Check Consent Form LG639.
- Volunteers new to 4-H or if did not complete the training last year, will need to complete the Orientation Training.

State 4-H Council Regional Representative Application

The Missouri State 4-H Council is an elected body of 4-H youth who serve as the voice of Missouri 4-H youth for one year terms. Council members help plan and implement events like State 4-H Congress and Teen Conference. They represent Missouri 4-H at national, regional, and state events, donating volunteer hours at the Missouri State Fair, State 4-H Contest Days, and other 4-H events. Council members are ambassadors and spokespersons for Missouri 4-H. Any 4-H participant, age 14-17 on January 1 of the election year, may apply to be a candidate for Regional Representative. The 4-H'er must meet the age requirements listed above, must be currently enrolled in a 4-H program, in good standing in their local 4-H club or unit, and have completed the previous year of 4-H work. If you are interested in being a Regional Representative, please complete the Regional Representative Application

(https://extension.missouri.edu/media/wysiwyg/Extensiondata/Pro/4h/Docs/GetInvolved/StateCouncil/ regional-rep-app.pdf) by January 15th. Youth will have to interviews at a later date determined by the West Central Region.
