
Cooper County Resource Guide



Providing information on resources throughout the county to help meet basic needs.

Introduction

In October 2016, Central Missouri Community Action (CMCA) conducted a Cooper County Community Wide Poverty Simulation. These simulations are designed for those who have never experienced the realities of living in poverty. Through the three hour simulation process, participants are assigned a family member role to "play" as they attempt to meet their family's basic needs for one month. The month is simulated by four (4) 15-minute weeks during which families must meet all of their financial obligations, gain or maintain employment, ensure that their children are fed, clothed, and educated, meet any emergency situations that may arise and attempt to navigate the web of social service entities that are designed to provide assistance to families in need.

The goal of the Community Wide Poverty Simulation was to give specific people in the community (business leaders, community leaders, school district professionals, city government, county government, and etc.) a shared experience around the social issue of poverty. After this shared experience, participants were asked to join one of four Community Action Teams that were developed by Evan Melkersman, CMCA's Community Organizer for Cooper and Howard counties. Community Action Teams (CATs) are made up of local community members who are dedicated to addressing a local cause or condition of poverty. The teams were structured around CMCA's Strategic Commitments (Basic Needs, Economic Development, Lifelong Learning, and Building Relationships Across Class and Race Lines).

The Cooper County Basic Needs Resources CAT held their first meeting in November 2016, and quickly began looking at resources that exist to address basic needs and what gaps exist within the county. For their initial project, they decided to develop a "Cooper County Basic Needs Resource Guide." This guide highlights and provides contact information for the local agencies/organizations that currently exist to address a variety of basic needs including health/mental health, education, shelter, food, clothing, transportation, employment, and child care.

Inclusion in the Guide does not imply endorsement of any agency or its programs by CMCA or the Cooper County Basic Needs Resources CAT, nor does its exclusion imply a lack of approval. Appropriate agencies and groups that may have been omitted should be brought to the attention of the Cooper County Basic Needs Resources CAT. We request that the creation of new agencies, changes in existing agencies, and the dissolution of agencies be reported to the listed team's contact so that this information any be used in the updates to future editions of this Guide.

The Basic Needs Resource CAT recommends that you always call the agency or resource to verify that the services you need are still offered.
