I am sure that over the years you have seen this story about time by R. G. Lee, but I thought that it would be appropriate to use it again in starting the new year.

Your Daily "Bank" Account

If you had a bank that credited your account each morning with \$86,400, that carried no balance from day to day, allowed you to keep no cash in your account, and finally every evening cancelled whatever part of the amount you had failed to use during the day, what would you do? Draw out every cent-of course!

Well, you have such a bank and its name is "TIME." Every morning it credits you with 86,400 seconds. Every night it rules off-as lost - whatever of this you have failed to invest to good purpose. It carries no balances. It allows no balances. It allows no overdrafts. Each day the bank named "TIME" opens a new account with you. Each night it burns the records of the day. If you fail to use the day's deposits the loss is yours.

MSF Scholarships

The Missouri State Fair and the Youth in Agriculture Committee are accepting applications for Youth in Agriculture scholarships for Missouri high school seniors graduating in 2021. The application form can be found on the Fair's website. Applications should be submitted to the Missouri State Fair and must be postmarked by February 1, 2021. Applicants must submit an original copy of their application and three additional copies. A total of 40 scholarships will be awarded. Applicants must be high school seniors and active members of Missouri 4-H or FFA and have participated at least once as a 4-H or FFA exhibitor at the Missouri State Fair. Selected students must enroll (fall and/or spring semester immediately following graduation from high school) in an accredited community college, college or university in the state of Missouri. Applicants are not required to pursue a degree in agriculture; however, a five-point bonus will be given to applicants pursuing a degree in agriculture during the selection process.

Missouri Agribusiness Academy

The Missouri Department of Agriculture is offering 30 high school students representing 4-H clubs and FFA chapters, as well as farm families, throughout Missouri the opportunity to explore careers in agriculture through the 2021 Missouri Agribusiness Academy (MAbA). MAbA is a competitive program for sophomores interested in pursuing agriculture-related degrees and careers. Applications can be found on MDA's website and are due February 1, 2021.

Missouri 4-H STEM Extravaganza

Saturday, May 1, 2021

The Missouri 4-H STEM Extravaganza will allow 4-H members in the Robotics and Computer Science projects an opportunity to showcase the skills they have gained in teamwork, engineering, programming, and problem solving. There will be a few contests: RoboPet Challenge, Robot Exhibition, Computer Science contest, and STEM Projects Exhibition. Robot platforms include Lego Mindstorms, VEX IQ/EDR/V5, or any other appropriate robot meeting the requirements of the challenges. Interviews are part of the challenges. Participants may also have an educational display and/or demonstration.

STEM Extravaganza Challenges

Registration: Jan. 1--April 26 in 4-H Online

The challenge is open to Missouri 4-H members. There is no requirement to qualify at a local robotics event.

This is an individual or team challenge: youth may be part of a team of 2–5 youth in the same age division. There is a participant fee of \$10 per youth; with \$5 entry fee per youth per challenge entered.

Investigate STEM Contest

Registration: open through March 1 in 4-H Online (must include a summary of your project). Youth (ages 11-18) will identify a STEM based problem/question and develop a solution using the scientific process. Divisions include:

- Animal and Plant Sciences
- Natural Resources, Environmental Sciences, and Energy
- Engineering and Technology
- Other

Shooting Sports Updates

Shooting Sports Safety

The 740 Shooting Sports Project which is a mandatory, one-time project for all shooting sports members is ideally held in person. However, we recognize that this is impossible in some counties at this time. This project has been revamped and will be available through Canvas with approval of County 4-H specialists to those counties that cannot currently hold face to face meetings due to Covid. You will register through 4-H Online as you would for any event in the 740 Shooting Sports Safety training at a cost of \$5.00 per family. Registration will open January 15 and will stay open through April.



This class will not be approved for any county that is holding in person classes.

Instructor Certification

The State Shooting Sports Advisory committee has met and is aware that there is a serious need for Shooting Sports Instructor Certification classes. Due to policies at the National and State levels in Shooting Sport and due to the restrictions placed on us by the CDC, holding large in-person trainings is impossible at this time. However, we have come up with some stop-gap training measures for areas with the greatest need. If you are in one of these areas, please work through your local Extension office.

2020 State Team Tryouts

The selection process for the nine state shooting teams began this fall after the completion of the State Shoot. 4-H youth selected for the state shooting teams represent Missouri 4-H at the National Invitational Match to be held June 20 - June 25 in Grand Island, Nebraska.

State 4-H Executive Council Elections

Recently, the bylaws of the Missouri 4-H State Council have changed, and this effects how many members sit on the council and who can run for office. It is time to apply if you would like to run for an Executive Committee position.

What is State 4-H Council?

State 4-H Council is the representative body of all Missouri 4-H'ers at the state level and consists of 5 Executive Committee members and one Regional Representative from each of the 8 Regions. They assist with planning and implementing statewide 4-H programs, give input on 4-H program and policy issues and work to address the issues and concerns most important to Missouri 4-H youth. Examples of their leadership can be seen through their work with Teen Conference, State Congress, and the Kids Helping Kids Grant. They often volunteer at statewide 4-H events, as well as represent Missouri 4-H at the State Fair.

Who is eligible to apply?

All youth ages 14-18 (on 12/31/2020) who are enrolled in a Missouri 4-H program are invited to apply. No prior involvement with the State 4-H Council is required to run for an Executive Committee position.

What positions can youth apply for?

• <u>President</u>: serves as chairperson of the Exec. Committee and presides over meetings of the Mo State 4-H Council and some assemblies during State 4-H Congress. The President shall keep a transparent line of communication with Council members, executive committee, and adult advisors.

- <u>Vice President</u>: serves as Parliamentarian. In the absence of the President, they preside over meetings. They oversee all standing committees and oversees the review of the Council's governing documents.
- <u>Secretary</u>: keeps the minutes of every meeting of the Exec. Committee and State 4-H Council. The secretary is responsible for keeping attendance and ensuring that attendance policies are enforced.
- <u>Treasurer</u>: is responsible for the disbursement of Kids Helping Kids funds and oversees the 4-H'ers Helping 4-H'ers endowment. The Treasurer also serves as the Missouri 4-H Foundation Trustee.
- <u>Outreach Coordinator</u>: is responsible for overseeing and collaborating with the State 4-H Office on all official external communication channels of the State 4-H Council. This includes, but is not limited to, social media, email and print publications.

What about Regional Representatives?

Regional Representatives must apply via the separate application process. Regional Representatives are also part of the Council, but they are selected by their Region. More information about the Regional Representative application can be found <a href="https://example.com/here.com/

How to apply.

Applications are due **January 1st, 2021** however, applications are still being accepted!

Interested youth must submit an Executive Officer Application form, a resume, a letter of interest and a minimum of two letters of recommendation (one 4-H staff/faculty and one from a professional or personal reference of their choice) to Council Coordinator, Samantha Brandeberry via email (brandeberrys@missouri.edu) or postal mail (1110 S College Avenue Columbia, MO 65211).

Interviews will take place February 1st-4th for those candidates chosen by the professional panel. 10 candidates (two per office) will be announced and have the opportunity to campaign at State 4-H Congress and give speeches in front of their peers. All Missouri 4-H members 4-H ages 14-18 will vote to select their State 4-H Council Exec Committee. Installation of officers takes place on the final morning of State 4-H Congress.

Soapy Snowman

Materials/Supplies per person

- ½ cup water
- Mixer
- 2 cups Ivory Snow Detergent (not liquid!)
- Toothpicks, buttons, sticks, beads, felt scraps, yarn, chenille sticks, etc.

Instructions

- 1. Mix Ivory Snow Detergent with water until it is a dough consistency (a mixer works well).
- 2. Right away, shape the dough into 3 different sized balls.
- 3. Use toothpicks to hold the balls together as you stack them.
- 4. Add the decorations arms, scarf, hat, etc.
