Dear 4-H Families.

Just as we stop for one day in September and recognize those who labor, we should also take some time to stop and recognize the good things we do in 4-H. Take pride in your own accomplishments; you can do that without being boastful. As you choose your projects for this year think about what you want to be doing when Labor Day is there to recognize you. Volunteers for the 2021-2022 4-H Year

Returning volunteers **will not** need to resubmit the form for background screening. However, the 4-H Volunteer Orientation does need to be completed, prior to starting project meetings. Club officers / Youth leaders

When enrolling you must select **yes** as a volunteer. For club officer, select the club tab and designate your club officer status. For youth leader, select the projects tab and add youth leader under volunteer type for the project(s) you will be helping to lead. As a youth volunteer you will not be required to do a background check.

4-H online

It is very **IMPORTANT** and **your responsibility** to keep ALL your online 4-H information up-to-date so that we are able to keep you informed. If you have further questions, give us a call.

Project enrollment guidelines

First year member - three projects. Second year or higher age 8-10 - three projects. Age 11 or older six projects. Exploring, Leadership, Shooting Sports Safety and Entrepreneurship can be carried in addition to these totals. If you wish to carry more than the recommendation then you will need to make an appointment to come and talk to Bob to request the additional projects.

Self-Determined projects

The self-determined project is exactly what it sounds like – you decide what topic you want to learn about, set goals for yourself, plan how to meet those goals, and evaluate your efforts. This project is for youth who want to enroll in projects that 4-H doesn't offer or who want to study a regular 4-H project in more depth and detail. Guidelines for planning a Self-Determined Project:

- · Narrow down project to one interest area.
- · Set goals on what you hope to learn or accomplish.
- · Make a list of supplies, materials, or facilities needed.
- · Estimate cost of supplies and materials.
- · Identify references.
- · Identify a project leader.
- · Develop a step-by-step plan of action.
- · Record results and evaluate.

Anyone interested in the Self-Determined Project needs to obtain a copy of the 4-H guide sheet Y951, "Choose your own direction," which outlines the process needed to choose and complete a Self-Determined Project. If you have any questions contact the County 4-H Office.

4-H Sportfishing Volunteer Certification Training

4-H Sportfishing Volunteer Certification Training is now available in 4-H Online. Volunteers must complete the certification to be sportfishing leaders. For those that completed the prior approval process, they will not need to take the new 4-H Online sportfishing certification.

Steps to for volunteers to complete certification:

- Order or borrow the National 4-H CCS Sportfishing Curriculum (Fishing Curriculum Set of 4). These can be found on shop4-H.org.
- Review the MO 4-H State Sportfishing Plan.
- Review curriculum resources.
- Complete the Sportfishing Leader Training and Quiz in <u>4-H Online</u>. Leaders **must** have a profile in 4-H Online and be approved 4-H volunteers.
 - They can access it in 4-H Online by logging into their profile, select "trainings" from the left side column, select "register", and then complete the "Sport Fishing Leader Training."
 - The quiz will be graded (80% is passing). If the volunteer does not pass, they may complete the training and quiz again.

4-H STEM Challenge

Each year, 4-H has a STEM Challenge that is launched in October. This year it is called Galactic Quest.

Designed by Clemson University, the 2021 4-H STEM Challenge, Galactic Quest, focuses on the mysteries and adventures of space exploration. Galactic Quest explores the history of humans in space, the technology and resources needed for missions, and the obstacles humans encounter in orbit. Activities explore important STEM topics ranging from physics and engineering to computer science and space agriculture.



Counties around Missouri have been asked if they would like to have a kit for their program. Check with your 4-H office to see if they are planning to participate this year. Fall Instructor Certification

Leader Certification will be held in a 2-part format.

<u>Part 1</u>:

This is an online training provided by the National Shooting Sports Committee that **MUST** be completed **BEFORE** the in-person portion of the training. The cost is \$20 per person, and you can complete the training at https://www.4-hshootingsportscollege.com/. This is a ONE-TIME training.

Part 2:

October 1-2, 2021, at Camp Jo-Ota, Clarence, Mo

This will be a new format for these trainings! Friday night session begins at 6PM and is mandatory for all participants. The workshop will end Saturday evening-no Sunday portion.

Both portions (part 1 & 2) MUST be completed before certification will be granted. Registration fees includes on-site camp housing, if you prefer other lodging arrangements, those are on your own. All meals on Saturday are included. Friday will only include an evening snack



2021 State Team Tryouts

The selection process for the nine state shooting teams begins this fall after the completion of the state shoot. 4-H youth selected for the state shooting teams will represent Missouri 4-H at the National Invitational Match to be held **June 26** – **July 1, 2022, in Grand Island, Nebraska**. Any 4-H Shooting Sports member who is in good standing with their county program, enrolled in the appropriate project number and at least 14 years old (must be 14 years old by December 31, 2021) may participate in the selection process. If numbers and space allow, 13-year-olds may participate for the experience, but are not eligible for the state team. Nearly all of the team selection process is comprised of multiple try out dates. Each team has a unique process.

Pre-registration will be in 4-H Online Aug. 1 –Sept. 15. If you do not pre-register, you may register on site the day of tryouts and pay the registration fee there. Cash or check only, no cards accepted onsite.
