

4-H Livestock Project Record Books

All 4-H livestock members entering animal(s) in the Dent County 4-H/FFA Expo must have one project record book to be presented at registration. The book will combine records for all exhibited animals at the Expo. It must include the following forms:

1. Project Reports
2. Feed Record
3. Story about the project(s) with pictures (include captions)
4. Animal Care Checklist/Animal Treatment Record
5. Health Certificate (sheep only)
6. Member in Good Standing form

Each animal must have an individual project record form. The same species records can be combined on the feed record form, animal care checklist form and member in good standing form. Different species must each have a separate feed record form. Only one story that includes all exhibited animals is required.

Recognition Night Awards

In September if you want to apply for a county 4-H Award for Recognition Night you need to add the following:

1. Project Award Application (yellow form)

Be sure your project leader signs your Project Report and your club leader signs your Project Award Application before turning it in.

****Instructions for filling out "The Missouri Project Record" form:***

Front side: Goal Setting Section—provide information for the animal project listed at the top of the form; Learning/Leadership Experiences Section—provide information for all activities participated in for the current year, activities should be listed vertically under each column category

Back side: Knowledge and Skills Section—provide information pertaining to your project for the current year; Information and Financial Summary sections are for the project listed on the front of the form

****Instructions for filling out additional "Missouri Project Record" forms included in the record book:***

Fill out all sections front and back EXCEPT 'Learning/Leadership Experiences'. In this section write "see main project form" or "same as main project form". This section should be the same information for every project, but only has to be written out for the first project in the record book.
