Dear Missouri 4-H family,

This month I would like to share with you our Missouri 4-H Annual Report. This report summarizes the efforts of more than 9000 amazing volunteers, and 140 Missouri 4-H academic and staff members who are devoted to develop and deliver quality 4-H programs around the state. During 2018-2019 our program had 57,072 Members and who contributed with more than 93,000 hours of community service, and Missouri 4-H collected more than 103,000 meals during 4-H Feeding Missouri.

Our goal is to grow our program 10% this year to reach our goal of reaching 20% of our youth by 2025.

We are an amazing team! Thank you for all your contributions.

I also would like to share with you the importance of having a conversation about the importance of the Missouri 4-H Club Check list with your county academics and staff members. They are responsible for collecting the information and sending it to the 4-H State office. I truly would appreciate if you can work with all of us to make this happen. Our program is growing and we need to be sure we are in compliance with all policies and procedures. Right now we have 729 active/chartered Community Clubs, 159 SPIN Clubs, 15 In-School and 52 Afterschool clubs.

Remember to continue working in our 4-H Feeding Missouri Campaign.

#### Call to ALL 4-H'ers: Be counted in the 2020 Missouri census

In Missouri 4-H, we take civic engagement seriously and one of the ways to be a good citizen is to make sure you are counted in the 2020 Census! Please use the information provided to educate yourself, your family, your friends, and your 4-H club about why they should be counted in the census.

#### What is the census?

Every 10 years, the U.S. Census Bureau is required to count every person — whatever their age or citizenship status — living in the United States.

#### Why do we have a census?

The U.S. Census helps determine federal funding, services and political representation for each state for the next 10 years. The information also helps local communities — and partners like MU Extension (Missouri 4-H is part of MU Extension) — plan for future needs and challenges.

The 2020 Census is our chance to make sure the tax dollars we send to Washington, D.C. make their way back to Missouri.

When every person living in Missouri is counted — regardless of age or citizenship status — we get more money for jobs, schools, housing, roads and bridges, hospitals and more.

For every adult and child **NOT counted in the last census**, Missouri lost \$1,300 in federal dollars every year for the last 10 years — \$13,000 fewer federal dollars for every uncounted person.

In 2020, be sure you are counted because Missouri counts! You count!

#### When is the census?

From March to July 31, 2020: Each person should be counted according to where they are residing on April 1, 2020. In

March, households will receive the first of four mailings explaining how to fill out the Census form **online** and other count options.

#### Missouri State Fair Nose Print Reminder

The deadline for providing a legible nose print on a card with proper identification is March 15<sup>th</sup> for steers and market heifers and June 15<sup>th</sup> for lambs and meat goats. The nose prints must have the correct postmark date on them, and also be received within 10 days following. (Faxes are not acceptable; postmarks must meet deadline dates; metered mail is not preferred, but if used, please allow sufficient time for delivery.) Below you will find a copy of the rules surrounding nose prints from the state fair premium guide for reference.

#### NOSE PRINTING STEER, MARKET HEIFER, MARKET LAMBS AND MEAT GOATS

A. Each Agriculture Teacher and Extension Agent will be responsible for mailing or delivering ALL cards to the Missouri State Fair by the deadline specified in this premium catalog. Nose print cards will only be mailed to and received from Agriculture Teachers and Extension Agents. No nose prints will be accepted from individuals. There will be no exceptions.

- B. The deadline for providing a legible nose print on a card with proper identification is March 15 for steers and market heifers; and June 15 for lambs and meat goats. The nose prints must have the correct postmark date on them, and also be received within 10 days following. (Faxes are not acceptable; postmarks must meet deadline dates; metered mail is not preferred, but if used, please allow sufficient time for delivery.)
- C. Nose prints must be on the card provided by the Missouri State Fair and show the date, exhibitor name, county, and animal ID number. The ID number may be a tattoo or ear tag.
- D. The nose print card is for file reference only and does not constitute an entry into any class. Normal entry procedures must be followed per the Missouri State Fair 2018 premium guide.

- E. Each exhibitor may nominate a total of six (6) steers and six (6) market heifers. These may be the same or different breeds. Steers and Market Heifers may be purebred, crossbred or a combination to be nominated.
- F. Each exhibitor may nominate a total of ten (10) market lambs. A given animal may be nominated by brother or sister on separate forms.
- G. Each exhibitor may nominate a total of ten (10) meat goats. A given animal may be nominated by brother or sister on separate forms.
- H. An exhibitor may enter an animal in the Missouri State Fair that does not have a nose print or barrow DNA card on file, but such animal will not be eligible for breed champion or Grand Champion in that division.

#### Community Improvement Grants Available to 4-H and FFA Youth



### **Shooting Sports Opportunities**

#### 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Certification Workshop

WHEN: April 3-5, 2020 First Session: 7:30 pm – Friday

WHERE: Pinecrest, Fredericktown, MO Final session concludes: 3:15 pm – Sunday

Check-In: 6:00-7:15 pm Friday, April 3 for ALL participants

All participants must attend Friday night session. Volunteer orientation is a separate requirement that cannot be

completed at workshop.

COST: \$100 - includes 5 meals, overnight lodging (1 or 2 nights), and workshop materials

**REGISTRATION:** Required no later than March 15

Registration is limited and will close when a discipline class reaches maximum number; or when the camp is full. All registrations accepted on a first-come, first-served basis when accompanied by fee. Workshops usually fill up before the deadline, so don't delay!

Registration must be done via 4HOnline and payment can be selected as credit card or check. Family members already in the 4-H Online system should access their family profile to register. If new to 4-H, you are asked to go to the internet and use either Chrome or FireFox browser (not Internet Explorer) at <a href="https://mo.4honline.com">https://mo.4honline.com</a> and follow the instructions on creating a family and adult profile.

The workshop will be composed of 18-20 hours of training. Twelve hours of that time will be for a specific discipline (project). Training will include covering the curriculum and lesson plans from the National 4-H Shooting Sports program, opportunities to teach to your peer group, and a range practicum. The philosophy and principles of working with 4-H youth is a critical part of the training.

Registration will be via 4HOnline. If you do not have a 4HOnline profile, you will need to make one. Profile creation is found on the same page as login.

New programs must send a team of volunteers to this workshop. Counties with current Western Heritage program may submit one or more volunteers to this workshop.

**LODGING NOTES:** This is a "church camp" setting (bunks in dorms/cabins). Men and women are housed separately. You will need to provide your own bedding. Cabins are not heated! Participants have the option of making their own lodging arrangements in the nearby town, but there will be no cost reduction.

**DIRECTIONS TO CAMP:** Take State Highway 151north of Clarence to Route MM, turn east on MM and go 1.5 miles to Camp Jo-Ota sign. Turn north onto gravel road at sign and follow into camp.

**REQUIREMENTS:** A certified leader (instructor) must be at least 21 years of age. Volunteers 18 years of age may attend and may serve as Assistant Leaders- but will not be recognized as a Certified Leader (instructor) until their 21<sup>st</sup> birthday. A certified instructor may not have any felony convictions - nor any game and fish law violations within the past two years.

**PAYMENT: Credit Card payment preferred...at time of online registration.** If paying by check make check payable to **University of Missouri** and deliver to YOUR County Extension office A.S.A.P.

Until payment is received, you are not officially pre-registered and your registration will not be accepted.

A letter of confirmation and further details will be emailed after registration closes. If not accepted, you will be notified immediately.

#### Missouri 4-H Shooting Sports Ambassador Program Applications now being accepted \*

Missouri 4-H Shooting Sports Ambassador Program is designed to promote 4-H and 4-H Shooting Sports. Youth selected to serve as Ambassadors will receive training that will allow them to return to their home counties and advocate for the program at the county, regional, and state level. Ambassadors provide public relations support at special events such as donor/sponsor functions and also serve as spokespersons for the 4-H Shooting Sports Program, helping to make 4-H and the 4-H Shooting Sports Programs more visible. The Ambassador's further develop their skills in leadership, public presentation, citizenship, community service, public relations and team building.

Applicants must be at least 12 years of age by January 1, 2020 to apply. It is recommended that the candidates also have at least one year left in 4-H.

This Program will serve as a gateway to becoming a National 4-H Shooting Sports Ambassador. Application packets are available on the Shooting Sports Ambassador webpage



#### **Horse Bowl State Contest**

#### Saturday, April 4, 2020

Animal Science Center, University of Missouri-Columbia, 920 East Campus Drive

The primary objective of Horse Bowl contests is to provide an opportunity for youth enrolled in 4-H horse projects to demonstrate their knowledge of equine related subject matter in a competitive setting where attitudes of friendliness and fairness



Youth and coaches must register through 4HOnline. Cost is \$25 per individual and no fee for coaches. Deadline to register is **March 1st**. Only Junior-Juniors can sign-up as individuals to be formed into teams the day of the contest.

Contest day check in for registered youth is at 9:00 a.m. Contest starts at 9:30 a.m. Registered youth and coaches will receive an information letter with maps, details, etc. Junior and seniors must register as a team.



#### **Hippology State Contest**

#### Sunday, April 5, 2020

Animal Science Center, University of Missouri-Columbia, 920 East Campus Drive

Hippology is an activity that can enhance learning for 4-H members by letting them exhibit their knowledge and understanding of equine science and husbandry in a competitive setting. The term "Hippology" comes from the Greek "hippo", meaning horse, and "ology",

meaning "the study of". The primary objective of the Hippology Contest is to provide an opportunity for youth enrolled in a 4-H Horsemanship and Horseless Horse projects to demonstrate their depth and breadth of their horse knowledge in competitive setting where attitudes of friendship and fairness prevail.
