

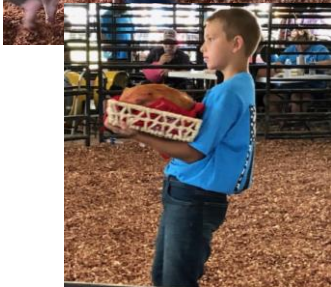

Once you are selected in your county to do a demonstration in the 4-H Building at the State Fair, don't forget to sign up in 4HOnline to reserve your spot! Open now until August 1.

Missouri Shooting Sports State Team Tryout Dates

The selection process for the nine state shooting teams begins this fall after the completion of the state shoot. 4-H youth selected for the state shooting teams will represent Missouri 4-H at the National Invitational Match to be held June 21 - June 26 in Grand Island, Nebraska. Any 4-H Shooting Sports member who is in good standing with their county program, enrolled in the appropriate project number and at least 14 years old (must be 14 years old by December 31, 2019) may participate in the selection process. If numbers and space allows, 13-year-olds may participate for the experience, but are not eligible for the state team. Nearly all of the team selection process is comprised of multiple try out dates. Pre-registration form is required with payment due 2 weeks before first disciple tryout. Telling the state instructor does not qualify for pre-registration. Contact Jim Sappington with questions.

October 19, 2019



State Livestock Judging Contest

What are the characteristics to look for in a food animal that yields the most ideal meat products? Or are you interested in gaining skills to select your market animal to exhibit at the fair? The ultimate goal of livestock judging is to compare your perception of an animal against the ideal and then to contrast your opinion with that of another individual or group of individuals.

- Registration in 4HOnline, deadline **August 15th**.
- Cost is \$25 per individual and no fee for coaches. **No refunds.**
- Registration is limited to one junior and one senior team per county who have qualified at county contest. Youth and coaches must register. Substitutions are accepted before and day of contest.

- Members may participate in only one contest when they are held on the same day.

First Session: 7:30 pm – Friday Final session concludes 3:15 pm – Sunday

COST: \$100 - includes 5 meals, overnight lodging (1 or 2 nights), and workshop materials

REGISTRATION: Required no later than August 31

Registration is limited and will close when a discipline class reaches maximum number; or when the camp is full. All registrations accepted on a first-come, first-served basis when accompanied by fee. Workshops usually fill up before the deadline, so don't delay! Register A.S.A.P.

\$10 – Per Meal cost (noon and evening) for parents, siblings, other guests. (When youth participant registers, there will be option to indicate guests – and pay for everyone...at time of youth registration. No adult or guest registration required.)

Period Clothing: Each youth participant is expected to be in Period Dress.

A panel of judges will evaluate and score participants based upon dress and knowledge.

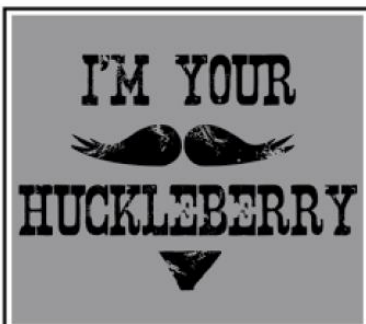
Western Knowledge quiz: The knowledge quiz is a part of normal 4-H Western Heritage competition. Every participant will complete a quiz. The quiz will be True/False, multiple choice, and firearm identification.

We will have multiple examples of period firearms (or replicas) on hand.

Cowboy Action Shooting Competition: Participant must have cowboy shooting experience. Must have shot previous competition or practiced under 4-H supervision before this event. Must know & understand state rules and procedures. Awards presented to each division.

- Junior - Rimfire rifles only – rifles acceptable to standards of 4-H Western Heritage policies.
- Intermediate – 2 revolvers and a rifle. Rimfire only. And shotgun. Period appropriate per rules.
- Senior – 2 revolvers, rifle & shotgun.
