Regional Representatives

Teens who care about 4-H may want to serve on the Missouri State 4-H Council. The council is an elected body of youth that plan Teen Conference and State 4-H Congress and serve as a voice for Missouri 4-H. If you are 14-17 years of age, a member in good standing, and completed the previous year of 4-H work, you may run for a Regional Representative position. An application form along with a letter stating why you want to serve on the State 4-H council is due to your County Extension office by January 13.

Horse Ownership

Each Exhibitor must own or manage all horses shown beginning no later than May 1 of current year. Ownership is desired, but not required. Management is defined as the animal being under the complete care of the 4-H member for the time they are enrolled in the project. Also, horses shall not receive professional training, showing or handling after May 1 of the current year.

Montgomery County Fair Livestock Weigh-in Dates

The **steer weigh-in** will be held Saturday, February 11, 2023 from 8:00-10:00 a.m., no late arrivals accepted. There is a minimum 1,000-pound weight at the fair for steers. The hog weigh-in will be held Saturday, March 11, 2023 from 8:00-10:00 a.m., no late arrivals accepted. For hogs, there is a 60-pound maximum weight at time of weigh in and then minimum of 230 pounds at fair. The sheep and goat weigh-in will be April 22, 2023 from 8:00-9:00 a.m. For lambs, there is a 90-pound minimum at fair. For goats, there is a 50-pound minimum at fair. Animals will be weighed in during designated times, no exceptions. Please note the time change for sheep and goats. Only 2 animals of one species per exhibitor are allowed to be weighed in. Montgomery County Shooting Sports Reminders The Montgomery County Shooting Sports Safety class will be on February 4, 2023 with a weather make-up date of February 11. In keeping with the State Shooting Sports guidelines for 2023 and beyond the Shooting Sports Safety (SS740) class is only required once, your first year of shooting sports. SS740 does not count toward your project total. Shotgun, Cowboy Action/Western Heritage and Air Pistol/.22 Pistol generally meet on weekends. Air Rifle/.22 Rifle generally meet on Wednesdays. Archery generally meets on Thursdays. Both Muzzleloader and Hunting & Outdoor Skills will be participating with Warren County and a Warren County leader.

Warren County Crochet Project
