Volunteer Enrollment

All volunteers will need to fill out a volunteer background check form. It is a new form and screening system that will be good for multiple years! Volunteers will still need to enroll themselves in 4-HOnline and if a new volunteer, complete volunteer orientation. Family Care Safety Registry (FCSR) will do screening. You will receive an encrypted email with the details of your background check to review.

4-H Robotics Training

January 18-19, 2019

In Perry County, we need adult volunteers interested in learning about using the LEGO MINDSTORMS EV3 Robotics Kit with 4-H members. Perry County 4-H has robotics kits available for use. It isn't necessary to be currently enrolled as a project leader in robotics to attend. If you know of someone who may be willing to teach robotics, let me (Dianna 513-2899) know. Maybe several can go together. This training is held at the MU Computers on the Farm Conference.

The workshop will start with the basics and also include advanced features of the EV3.

When: Saturday, January 19, 9 am to 2 pm. Lunch break at 12 noon.

Where: Tan-Tar-A Resort, Osage Beach, MO

Why: The LEGO MINDSTORM EV3 is the most widely known and utilized robot for youth STEM

education. This model is used in the FIRST Lego League, Robofest, Best Robotics, as well as

4-H in challenges for young people who are interested in robotics.

How: Registration <u>due by January 14, 2019</u>. No registration fee, but travel and lodging expenses

The Saturday morning session will be hands on learning with the LEGO MINDSTORMS EV3 robotics kit. Topics to be covered are: Components of the EV3, Basic engineering and programming, Use of sensors, Equipment management tools, Activity lesson plans for youth.



The afternoon session will include other platforms for 4-H robotics such as Ozo Bots, Raspberry Pi, and Vex IQ. Participants will get hands on experience with robot equipment, co-learn with other 4-H volunteers and network with others in robotics.

This Training will be held with the Computers on the Farm Conference sponsored by the MU College of Agriculture, Food, and Natural Resources AgEBB. This is a user conference focused on technology on the farm. There will be a 4-H Technology Showcase on Friday night from 5 pm - 9 pm where youth, families and volunteers can experience technology used in 4-H projects in GIS, Computer Science and Robotics. Tan-Tar-A is offering a conference room rate of \$69 plus tax, per room. Make plans to come to the training on Friday and take advantage of this conference rate. 4-H members are welcome to demonstrate their use of technology at the conference on Saturday. Equine Tour - May 20-28

Do you dream of combining your equine passion with a future career, love to learn more about the horse industry and enjoy making new 4-H friends who share your love of horses? The University of MO Extension 4-H Annual Equine Career Tour may be just for you! The 2019 tour will explore the horse industry in Missouri, Illinois, Wisconsin, Michigan, Indiana, Ohio and Canada and is open to Missouri 4-H teens, ages 14-18. Tour highlights include collegiate equine education departments, harness



racing, visits to equine farms, meeting 4-H youth and touring Mackinac Island. Participants will learn from leading equine professionals in the fields of equine therapy, dressage, entertainment, training art, harness racing, equine facility management and equine welfare. \$650 tour fee provides charter bus transportation, 4-H staff chaperones and most all travel related expenses.
