

State Fair County Banners

Construction Instructions

Missouri will celebrate its Bicentennial in 2021. One way Missouri 4-H will join the celebration will be with updated county banners for the 4-H Building at the Missouri State Fair. Any county that does not submit their own banner will be represented by a generic 4-H banner. The old banners will be returned to the counties.

Please follow the guidelines given below when designing the county banner.

- 1. A PowerPoint template can be found in the Missouri 4-H Marketing Box Folder. Please save a copy of this template to your computer before starting your design. Do not modify the size or orientation of the slide. Banners should be one-sided.
- 2. The design selected for the banner should represent your county's heritage or "Claim to Fame", or should be symbolic of the 4-H or Extension programs. We encourage you to have some kind of contest or event that involves many people contributing their ideas to the design. Remember, the banners will be in the building for years, so the design should be "timeless."
- 3. The design used on the flag must include the name of the county. The name can be placed at any location on the flag that contributes to the overall attractiveness of the flag. Letters for the county name should be in a minimum font size of 216. There is no maximum letter size; the design will determine this. The county name should be readable from a distance of 30 feet. Do not include club names on the banner. Refer to the 4-H Branding Toolkit on the Missouri 4-H website for the correct logos and color palette.
- 4. Photos and graphics should be of high resolution to ensure a decent print quality.

I have to receive 5 pictures and 5paragraphs for you to complete this project. Sound fair enough?

Disclaimer—I have not tried these recipes.

Switzerland - May 1, 2020

Rösti is a potato dish made by frying (or occasionally baking) flat round patties of coarsely grated raw or parboiled (semi-cooked), seasoned potato in oil. They're crisp on the outside and soft and melting inside. Sometimes bacon, onion, cheese – and even apple – are added to the mix. It's eaten as a side dish to accompany fried eggs and spinach or a sausage meat called *fleischkäse*. It was originally eaten as a breakfast by Bern farmers but these days you'll find it enjoyed all over the world as well as in Switzerland where it's considered a national dish.

4 Tablespoons Butter 1 Teaspoon Salt 2 1/4 pounds Potatoes 2 3/4 Cups Water

- 1. Wash the potatoes, boil them in salted water and then peel them. Let cool completely, ideally overnight. Then grate the chilled potatoes with a grater.
- 2. Mix the potatoes and salt in a bowl.
- 3. Next, heat the butter in a pan and add the potato mixture and press to a cake.
- 4. Let it roast until the bottom side is crispy brown. Turn the **browned potatoes** by sliding them onto a plate and sliding them back into the pan on the other side. Fry the second side until crispy.
- 5. Serve hot.

Columbia (not Missouri) - May 8, 2020

Papas Chorreadas (Potatoes with Cream and Cheese Sauce)

Papas Chorreadas is a typical Colombian side dish, born in the Andean zone of the country, these creamy potatoes are delicious with meat dishes. And they are a must as a side dish for Sobrebarriga al Horno.

8 medium red potatoes, partially peeled

1 chicken bouillon cube

Water

1 tablespoon butter

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

1 ½ cups dice tomatoes

3 scallions cut into 2 inches long

1/4 teaspoon garlic powder

½ teaspoon cumin½ teaspoon salt

Pepper to taste

1 cup heavy whipping cream

1 tablespoon chopped cilantro

1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

- 1. Place the potatoes and chicken bouillon in a medium saucepan. Cover with water and bring to a boil and cook about 30 minutes until tender. Drain and set a side.
- 2. While the potatoes are cooking, heat the oil and butter in a frying pan over medium heat. Add onion and tomatoes, stir and cook about 7 minutes. Add garlic powder, cumin, salt and pepper. Stir and cook 2 minutes more.
- 3. Add cream, cilantro and cheese. Mix well and turn down the heat and cook for 3 minutes or until cheese has melted.

In a serving dish place the potatoes and pour the sauce on top. Serve them hot.

Korea - May 15, 2020

Corn Cheese

It's loaded with cheese and coated with butter, so it's very savory and smells warm and heavenly! It also has a sweet note at the same time, so it gives a more complex flavor. It's like eating Korean pizza toppings without a pizza base, because most <u>Korean pizza</u> is covered with sweet corn!

1 1/2 cups sweet corn kernels, canned, water drained

1 1/4 ounces colored bell peppers, diced

1 Tablespoon butter

1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese

A few sprinkles parsley flakes

Sauce:

2 1/2 Tbsp mayonnaise

1/2 Tbsp sugar (I used raw sugar)

A few sprinkles fine sea salt

A few sprinkles ground black pepper

Combine the sweet corn, bell peppers and the seasoning sauce in a bowl and mix them well.

Preheat a skillet over medium high heat. Add the butter and melt it. Reduce the heat to low, add the seasoned sweet corn and bell pepper mixture (from step 1) and gently spread it around the skillet.

Sprinkle around the cheese and parsley flakes on top of the corn mixture and cover. Cook it further on the stove until the cheese is melted (4 to 5 mins). Alternatively, you can cook it in the oven (220 C / 428 F) until the cheese is melted (about 5 mins). Use the broiler / grill if you want to brown the cheese.

Indonesia - May 22, 2020

Pineapple Rolls – amazing pastry filled with pineapple jam, a must-have for Lunar New Year in Southeast Asia!

Pineapple Roll Cake (Bahulu Gulung)

For Pineapple Jam
1 pineapple (skin, crown, eyes and core removed)
3/4 Cups baking (Castor) sugar (fine sugar)

For Roll Cake 9 large eggs 1 1/3 Cups sugar 2 1/4 Cups plain flour 1 Teaspoon vanilla extract

To Make the Pineapple Jam

Grate the pineapple into a thick and coarse pulp. Place the pineapple pulp and sugar into a large saucepan. Bring to the boil, then lower the heat to medium. Cook the jam until it thickens to a spreadable consistency, stirring occasionally. Set aside to cool.

To Make the Roll Cake

Preheat oven to 180°C/355F. Grease and line a 9 inch square cake tin. Beat the eggs and sugar with an electric mixer until fluffy. Add the vanilla extract and sift in the flour. Fold through gently with a rubber spatula. Pour the batter into the cake tin. Bake for 12 mins.

Remove the cake from tin immediately, then spread the pineapple jam on top. Carefully roll the cake and allow to cool seam side down. Allow to cool completely before slicing to serve.

Australia - May 29, 2020

Damper is often made on camping trips but this easy damper recipe for kids can be whipped up in your own kitchen with minimum fuss and maximum good fun. Simply sift flour and salt into a bowl, rub in butter until the mixture resembles fine crumbs then make a well to add milk and water.

Damper (Why not try some Vegemite—available on Amazon)

3 cups self-raising flour 1/2 tsp salt, optional 3 tbsp butter 1/2 cup milk 1/2 cup water

Preheat oven to 400°.

Sift flour and salt into a bowl, rub in butter until mixture resembles fine crumbs.

Make a well in the center, add the combined milk and water, mix lightly with a knife until dough leaves sides of bowl.

Gently knead on a lightly floured surface and then shape into a round, put on a greased oven tray. Pat into a round 5-7 inch diameter.

With sharp knife, cut two slits across dough like a cross, approximately 1cm deep.

Brush top of dough with milk. Sift a little extra flour over dough.

Bake for 10 minutes, or until golden brown.

Reduce heat to 325° and bake another 20 minutes or until cake tester/toothpick comes out clean.

Serving Suggestion: Best eaten with honey and butter the day it is made.

High Point/Reserve High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u> (one rider & one horse team) and <u>High Point/Reserve High Point RIDER</u> (awarded to exhibitors who <u>MUST</u> show multiple horses) will be given in each division: Walk-Trot, 13&U, and 14&O. (See Rules IV. Page 4)

- Prior to showing, exhibitors must select which award best suits their riding scenario and sign up for eligibility. To qualify for a high point award, exhibitors must <u>NOMINATE</u> themselves when entering. They must choose between High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u> OR High Point <u>RIDER</u> (You may NOT receive both High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u> and the High Point <u>RIDER</u>.)
- ❖ To qualify for a High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u>/High Point <u>RIDER</u> award, the exhibitor **must show in showmanship**. Points earned in "All Ages" or "Ponies" classes contribute towards your High Point age Category, unless specified.
- ❖ If you choose to show a horse in the "<u>Ponies</u>" Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure, you may ONLY show that horse in "Ponies" classes. You can NOT show the same horse in "Ponies," "Qtr.," or "Saddle type" classes. Select <u>ONE</u> Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure class that best represents the particular **horse** that is being exhibited. (See Rules III.G.3. Page 2)
- Each exhibitor may only show one horse per class.
- WALK-TROT may NOT enter classes that lope. Walk-Trot is "recommended" for exhibitors in their 1st or 2nd year of the horsemanship project.

*Properly fitted ASTM and SEI certified helmets will be required for all events in classes 7-17 and 34-45. A rider will be disqualified if the helmet is not on the exhibitor's head and fastened for the entire time the exhibitor is in the arena.

Pettis County 4-H/FFA Horse Show Rules and Regulations

Revised April 2020

I) Qualified Exhibitors

A) All 4-H or FFA members in good standings in their county and club may compete.

II) Judging

- A) AQHA Rules apply according to the judge's discretion.
- B) Judges decision is final.
- C) The Top 5 Exhibitors in each class will be placed.
- D) Ranch Riding and Ranchmanship will be judged based on ARHA Rules.

III) Signing-Up and Class Information

- A) PRE-ENTRIES are encouraged.
- B) 4-H Horse Enrollment Forms with dated proof of membership in good standing will be required at the time of entry. No person or horse will be able to show without this item. FFA must have a signed letter of good standings from their advisor.
- C) Proof of negative Coggins test is required. No horse will be allowed to show without this item.

D) No refunds due to show expenses.

- E) Each exhibitor may only show one horse per class.
- F) To qualify for a high point award, exhibitors must nominate themselves when entering. They must choose which award they want to be in the running for: High Point/Reserve High Point ALL AROUND (one rider & one horse) or High Point/Reserve High Point RIDER (one rider on multiple horses). One exhibitor may NOT receive both a High Point ALL AROUND and the High Point RIDER (See more under IV. High Point Award Rules)
- G) Exhibitors that would like to be in the running for a High Point/Reserve High Point

 ALL AROUND (one horse & rider) or a High Point/ Reserve High Point RIDER

 Award must show in showmanship. (See more under IV. High Point Award Rules)
- H) Exhibitors must sign-up in their appropriate age category or class.
 - 1) The Exhibitor must show in the age category that corresponds with their age as of January 1 of the current show year

2) Walk-Trot

- a) "Walk-Trot" classes are recommended for those <u>exhibitors</u> in their 1st or 2nd year of the horsemanship project.
- b) Walk-Trot <u>exhibitors</u> may never have loped in any horse show prior to the Pettis County 4-H/FFA Horse Show.
- c) Walk-Trot <u>exhibitors</u> may not enter classes that require loping, including speed events.
- d) Walk-Trot <u>exhibitors</u> may enter the following "All Ages" classes: Mare & Foal, Yearling, Pleasure Driving.
- e) Walk-Trot <u>exhibitors</u> may NOT enter the following "All Ages" classes: Ranch Riding, Ranchmanship, Reining.
- f) Walk-Trot <u>exhibitors</u> may NOT enter in "Ponies" classes, but they may show a pony in Walk-Trot classes.

3) Ponies

- a) Ponies are less that 56" tall.
- b) Pony classes are "All Ages" classes.
- c) If you choose to show a horse in the "<u>Ponies</u>" Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure, you may ONLY show that horse in "Ponies" classes. You can NOT show the same horse in "Ponies," "Qtr.," or "Saddle type" classes. Select <u>ONE</u> Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure class that best represents the particular <u>horse</u> that is being exhibited.
- d) Ponies may be entered in other classes that correspond with their rider's age category such as the following: Showmanship, Equitation, Horsemanship, Trail, Egg & Spoon, Barrels, Poles, Down & Back.
- e) In Pony classes, exhibitors are asked to lope.
 - i) Walk-Trot <u>exhibitors</u> may NOT enter Pony classes, but they may show a pony in Walk-Trot classes.

4) All Ages

- a) Pony classes are considered an "All Ages" class. A horse entered in a "Ponies" class may NOT enter any other Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure class.
- b) Points Earned in "All Ages" classes contribute towards each exhibitors appropriate age division, with the exception of the "Mare & Foal" & "Yearling" classes. The "Mare & Foal" & "Yearling" classes ONLY contribute towards the High Point **RIDER** awards.
- c) Walk-Trot Exhibitors may NOT show in the following "All Ages" classes: Ranch Horse Please, Ranchmanship, Reining. (See more under III. E. 2. Walk-Trot)
- d) Horses entered in Ranch Riding may not enter any other Western Pleasure class.
- e) Horses entered in Ranchmanship may not enter any other Western Horsemanship class.

f) Mare and Foal

- i) Foals are those that were born within the current show year.
- ii) The "Mare and Foal" class requires two 4-H/FFA exhibitors.
- iii) The "Mare and Foal" class contributes to the High Point Rider award, but it does NOT count towards a High Point (one horse & rider) award.
- iv) If needed, an adult party may assist the mare and foal handlers.

g) Yearlings

- i) Yearlings are those that were born one year prior to the current show year.
- ii) The "Yearling" class contributes towards a High Point **Rider** award, but it does NOT count towards a High Point (one horse and rider) award.

h) Pleasure Driving

i) A handler is "recommended" in the line-up.

i) Open Leadline/Walk-Whoa

- i) Exhibitors entered in these classes must be between the ages of 5 and 7 years old.
- ii) The horse and handler in these classes must be enrolled in 4-H/FFA.
- iii) If needed, an adult spotter is permitted in lead line.
- iv) A handler <u>MUST</u> be in the arena for Walk-Whoa. The handler must be a 4-H/FFA member.
- v) A properly fitted ASTM and SEI certified helmet is required to be worn by the rider.
- vi) There is no cost for the leadline/Walk-Whoa class.
- vii) This class does not contribute towards any High Point awards.
- **viii)** An exhibitor cannot show in both Leadline & Walk-Whoa. They must choose which one is the safest for them.

j) Ranch Riding

- i) Horses entered in this class may NOT enter another **western pleasure** class.
- ii) ARHA (American Ranch Horse Association) rule apply. This is a rail class that judges the horse. See the ARHA rule book for additional judging criteria.

k) Ranchmanship

- i) Horses entered in this class may NOT enter another **Western Horsemanship** class.
- ii) ARHA (American Ranch Horse Association) rules apply.

IV) High Point Award Rules

- A) To qualify for a high point award, exhibitors must **nominate** themselves when entering.
- B) Exhibitors must choose which award they want to be in the running for: High Point/Reserve High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u> (one rider & one horse) or High Point/Reserve High Point <u>RIDER</u> (one rider on multiple horses) for their age division. One exhibitor may NOT receive both a High Point award and a High Point **Rider** award.

- C) All exhibitors that nominate themselves to be in the running for either High Point/Reserve High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u> or High Point/Reserve High Point <u>RIDER</u> must show in **showmanship**.
- D) **High Point/Reserve High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u>** (one horse & rider) awards will be awarded in the following categories: Walk-Trot, 13 and Under, and 14 and Over.
 - 1) This award is based on one rider and one horse.
 - 2) If an exhibitor nominates themselves for this, they will NOT be in the running for a High Point **Rider** award.
 - 3) An exhibitor may nominate themselves for the High Point All Around **AND** the High Point **Games** award.
 - 4) All classes, <u>EXCEPT</u> Mare & Foal, Yearling, and Open Leadline, count towards an individual's High Point <u>ALL AROUND</u> (one horse & rider) category.
 - 5) Points earned in "Ponies" classes and the specified "All Ages", unless otherwise stated, contribute towards an individual's High Point All Around category as long as the same horse is being exhibited by the same rider. See specific class rules for more information.
 - a) Walk-Trot Exhibitors may enter "All Ages" classes **EXCEPT** Ranch Riding, Ranchmanship, and Reining. (See additional information under III. E. 2. Walk-Trot)
 - 6) The exhibitor in each category that accumulates the highest number of points with one horse will receive the High Point All Around (one horse and rider) award for their category. The exhibitor in each category that accumulates the second highest number of points with one horse will receive the Reserve High Point All Around award for their category.
 - a) The number of High Point All Around (one horse & rider) awards in each category
 - i. In each category, only one nominee will receive a High Point award, and only one nominee will receive a Reserve High Point award.
 - **b)** Ties will be broken for a High Point All Around award in the following ways:
 - i. The exhibitor that received the greatest amount of 1st places in their category throughout the day with one horse will receive the award.

ii. If the greatest number of 1st places does not break the tie, the exhibitor that places the highest in their showmanship category will receive the award.
