Thanks to 4-H, the Carrico sisters knew how to stay hydrated by licking moisture off leaves. They also sought shelter under the thick huckleberry brambles and stayed in place as soon as they realized they were lost. They stayed there until they were found. 44 hours later.

The girls are safe and sound and have an exciting adventure to tell.

Just Stop!

- Stop: Stop, stay calm, don't panic. Don't rush off in the wrong direction before you've had a think about how to get back.
- Think: Retrace your steps in your head and make a good plan. Don't move anywhere unless you have a good reason to move. If you're unsure, just stay put.
- Observe: Get out your map and compass or GPS and figure out which direction you need to go. Don't wander aimlessly or go off trail. Don't have one of those. Just stay put.
- Plan: Think through a plan to get back to the trail or trailhead. If you're not confident, or if you're injured, just stay put.

Clover Kids

Painted Flowerpot

Materials (per child)

- Unglazed clay (terracotta) flowerpot
- Acrylic paint
- Paintbrushes
- Optional pack of flower seeds or a young plant and potting soil
- Optional cellophane and ribbon to wrap the plant pot and plant

Directions

Using acrylic paints, each child decorates a clay plant pot. Butterflies, flowers, geometric shapes, or polka pots are decorations to consider. Let dry completely.

Optional: Children can fill the plant pot with potting soil and plant the seed of a fast growing flower (i.e., Marigold) or put in a small plant. Wrap with cellophane and tie with a ribbon.



After the meeting was adjourned, they played a game called "The Human Knot." Then they had a snack and went home.



Tinlee Jones did a demonstration on the "Differences between heifers, bulls, and steers".


Hadley Bruner made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Reagan. Meeting adjourned.



Old Business- None



Spring Paper Clover Campaign

The Spring 2019 Paper Clover Campaign is coming March 27 – April 7, 2019. As many of you know, this is a wonderful opportunity for 4-H clubs to partner with their local Tractor Supply Co. stores to hold instore fundraising events. Last spring, participating clubs raised \$11.134 for



store fundraising events. Last spring, participating clubs raised \$11,134 for 4-H in Missouri counties. Nationally the program raised over a million dollars for 4-H'ers across the country!

New this year, the top five states that increase their funds (based on % increase over last Spring) will be awarded an additional \$2000 to go towards their state 4-H Programs!

Following the Paper Clover promotion, 90% of the funds go back to the State 4-H program, of which 80% will be disbursed to the counties. The funds need to be used for scholarship support for 4-H'ers to attend camps or other leadership activities. This can include ambassador trainings, 4-H Teen conferences, Legislative Academy, and several other leadership opportunities. Ribbons and supplies may no longer be purchased with the funds. Be sure to let the office know the date and times of your participation at Tractor Supply. If we do not know that you participated, then we can not pass the bucks down to your club.
