It's here! The Feeding Missouri Food Drive starts today and continues the entire month on our quest to reach the **1 Million Meal** goal.

- 1. We are taking all of our donations to Open Door.
- **2.** Are we only collecting food? No. Giving food is one way to help. Monetary donations and volunteer hours also count to our **1 million-meal goal**. Feeding Missouri will calculate and convert all pounds of food and hours volunteered into equivalent meals.
- 3. How do we report the amount of food, volunteer hours, and money donated?
- Food & Volunteer hours: Bring your items to the Extension Center, **keep track** of your total volunteer hours and then Sherol will do the survey. The office will be keeping a running total also.
- Monetary donations: We know that sometimes people donate cash and/or checks to a club. Please ask people to make any checks out directly to Feeding Missouri. You can then bring donations to the office and on the last day of February we will make a check out to Feeding Missouri and mail out all monetary donations at one time.
- 4. Who is contacting the food banks/pantries/organizations/schools if we want to volunteer, drop off food, organize drives or make presentations, etc.? Sherol has already contacted Open Door to accept the donations. But you need to contact your local grocery to see if you can place a container at their door for donations.
- 5. What if I already collected food, can I report it? We are doing this in the spirit of giving—don't let the details get in the way. What ever you have collected just bring it to the office and we will get it recorded and reported.

**Blooming Cupcake Liners** 

What You Need Cupcake liners (in assorted colors)
Pipe cleaners (in green)
Craft glue
Craft knife



- 1. Pile 5 to 6 cupcake liners on top of one another. Using a craft knife, poke a hole through the center of the stack. 2. Take one pipe cleaner and apply a dab of hot glue to one end. Then secure one liner to this glue. Set aside to dry.
- 3. Once the glue has dried, scrunch the liner closed to create the look of a flower bud. 4. Repeat Step 2 with the additional liners, sliding onto the same pipe cleaner, securing with glue, and scrunching together. 5. Wrap the pipe cleaner around the base of the bloom, and bend the pipe cleaner to create a leaf-shape.
- 6. Give your Blooming Cupcake Flower to someone you love.





#### MOVE in 2019!

It's time to MOVE! As you know, MOVE promotes physical activity and encourages youths to engage in a broad range of activities such as walking, biking, running, swimming, dance, taekwondo, gardening and more.

The competitive period is from February 1 to April 30.

There is no pre-registration required. Here's what youth and adults need to do to participate:

• Enroll in the Move Across Missouri (MOVE) project (HF775) in 4HOnline in their profile. *Enrollment* in 4-H MOVE does not count as a part of county limits on projects.

From Feb 1 through April 30:

Using a paper tracking system found on the 4-H website at: <a href="http://4h.missouri.edu/4hmove/moveinfo">http://4h.missouri.edu/4hmove/moveinfo</a> youth and their families can "log" the number of minutes they accumulate throughout the year and during the competitive component of the MOVE program (scroll to the bottom of the website page and click "My Move Activity Log"). Record keeping through the paper tracking system is important because the competition period is from February 1 to April 30.

4-Hers and adults can register for the competitive event as individuals and/or as part of a team. An individual MOVEr may also be a part of a team. A team can consist of a family or members of a 4-H club or group.

From April 30 through May 14:

Youth and families will submit their total number of minutes logged throughout the competitive period in 4HOnline. The final reporting will take place inside of a no cost event registration that will only be open from April 30 and May 14.

### Scholarships for Seniors

Missouri 4-H Foundation: The Missouri 4-H Foundation offers educational scholarships for 4-H youth and former 4-H members pursuing post-secondary study. Sixty scholarships are available, each ranging from \$500 to \$2,500. One scholarship application permits the applicant to be considered for any available scholarship, subject to conditions specified by the donor. Applications are accepted after January 1 and are due with a post-mark date of March 1 to the state 4-H office. <a href="https://extension2.missouri.edu/programs/missouri-4-h-foundation/scholarships">https://extension2.missouri.edu/programs/missouri-4-h-foundation/scholarships</a>

West Central Electric: WCE offers three scholarship programs to graduating seniors in our service area. The John and Kathryn English Scholarship Trust is a renewable scholarship given to seniors active in 4-H. Scholarship amounts depend on the current status of the trust fund. Applications are due on or before February 22, 2019. This year up to 20 high school seniors will receive the WCE Scholarship of \$500. Applications are due on or before March 15, 2019. The WCE and Lynn State Technical College Electrical Distribution System Scholarship Program provides for students a two-year scholarship in a quality college training program, a two-year college degree, and on-the-job training. Applications are due on or before April 1, 2019. #### FROG EYED PUDDING

Family Recipe from Sherol

1 c. Large Pearl Tapioca 1 c. Nut meats

4 c. water (cold) 1 tsp. salt

1 1/2 c. sugar 1 pt. Cool Whip

6 Banana's (sliced) 1 tall can Crushed pineapple (drained)



### Shaping Rural Missouri Grants

Developing a thriving rural Missouri is one of FCS Financial's values. The Shaping Rural Missouri grant program offers local 4-H and FFA organizations \$500 grants to implement projects that will benefit their rural communities. Funds will be awarded to assist club or chapter members in bringing positive change by establishing projects that make their local communities better places to live. Each proposal will be reviewed and scored by a grant review team.
