"A renowned chef, author and TV personality, Anne Burrell is a proud alumna of 4-H New York. She is host of the popular Food Network series *Secrets of a Restaurant Chef* and co-host of *Worst Cooks in America*. With her trademark spiky blonde hair and "pumped-up personality," Burrell has worked at some of the top restaurants in New York, studied the culinary land-scape and traditions of Italy, battled alongside Mario Batali as his sous chef on Food Network's Iron Chef America and wrote a New York Times best-selling cookbook. She also started in her own right on Next Iron Chef: Super Chefs in fall 2011.

Growing up in upstate New York, Burrell's passion for food and cooking began at an early age. After graduating with a degree in English from Canisius College in Buffalo, New York, she pursued her interest in the restaurant business by enrolling in the Culinary Institute of America. Following graduation, Burrell spent a year in Italy attending the Italian Culinary Institute for Foreigners and worked at a premier Tuscan restaurant. During this time, she grew to appreciate and understand the philosophy of Italian cuisine and culture, and hone her lasting culinary point of view.

Burrell loves to cook up engaging culinary lessons for America's kids to help them understand the science behind her mouth-watering recipes. She participated in the White House "We the Geeks" Google+ Hangout, along with White House pastry chef Bill Yosses and other special guests, to help kids and their parents see that science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) are key ingredients for culinary success. As part of Food Network's partnership with Time Warner Cable's Connect a Million Minds program, Chef Burrell also stars in a PSA to promote the fun of math and science."

- 4. Try placing your ears in different directions to see how the sound changes.


Did the sound change as the direction of the ears changed? How did the sound change? Did it get louder or quieter? Could you hear better with the cups on?

# Managed Care Coverage for 4-H Dues

Managed Care Coverage for 4-H Membership Dues. Youth covered by Managed Care plans, also known as Missouri Medicaid/MO Health-Net, are eligible to have their membership in one afterschool program or club paid by their insurance company. This includes membership fees for 4-H Clubs! If your member (s) are covered by one of these plans:

1. Call the Members services number for your insurer and request a voucher for each child.

- a. Aetna Better Health of Missouri:1-800-566-6444 .
- b. MissouriCare A WellCare Company: 1-800-322-6027.
- c. Home State Health: 1-855-694-4663
- 2. The insurance company will verify eligibility and send a voucher in the mail with a red or blue stamp on
- 3. Sign and date the voucher form and send the original form to your County Extension Office
- 4. Youth insurance company will pay for your child's membership in 4-H.
- 5. When you enroll through 4-H Online, select the 'pay by club/ check' option as you finish up enrollment. Do not pay with a debit or credit card, refunds will not be provided.

# Please Register at 4-HOnline

Have you updated your 4-H Registation at 4-HOnline? As most of your projects and state events require an "ACTIVE" status to even register, Please, get it done as soon as possible. The state would like to see all re-enrollments complete by December 31, 2018.

Here are the steps you will need to take to get enrolled.

- 1. Go to http://mo.4honline.com (notice there is no "www" in that address).
- 2. Log in to your family profile with your log-in email address. (If you can't remember your password, select "I forgot my password") Continue to your Family Member list.
- 3. Select "Edit" next to the member you are re-enrollling.
- 4. Select "Enroll for 2018-2019" at the bottom of the first page.
- 5. Review all content in the member profile, update any health form changes and change any projects (if you aren't enrolling in a project, delete it for this year).
- 6. Submit your enrollment, and pay required dues reflected on member invoices.
- 7. Please, please do NOT create a new profile, just update the old one. Even if your email address has changed, still use the old one to log in and then update to your new email address.

Again, this year all state event registrations will require a member to be in "Active" status in 4-HOnline. Members will remain in "Pending" status until the county review of membership and state membership dues are processed. Adult volunteer applicants remain in "Pending" status until all steps of the volunteer process are completed. If pay-ing by cash or check, you may send payment directly to the Extension Center at 1012A Thompson Blvd, Sedalia Mo 65301. Call the office at 660-827-0591 and Nan or Blake can assist as needed.

#### **Myth Masher Quiz Answers**

- 1. True One in 6 Americans lives in households that cannot always afford the food they need to lead healthy, active lives.
- 2. False Nearly 40 percent of all people seeking help with food in the United States are kids and working households. About 12 percent of all people seeking help with food are homeless. This does not mean that homelessness is a small problem we are talking about millions of people, but one reason that many people mistakenly believe that the homeless are the only group struggling with hunger is that they are often the most visible.
- 3. False Hunger is not caused by a lack of food; there is enough food to feed everyone in the world, but there are many barriers that prevent people from getting the food they need. Barriers in this country include, but are not limited to: not having enough money to buy food, not having access to a grocery store, or not having transportation.
- 4. True Children who go to school hungry are often tired and unable to concentrate. Hunger also leads to illness and hinders development.
- 5. False Many hard working people earn wages that do not cover basic household expenses. In the United States, many workers earn far less than what a family needs for housing, food, and transportation. Additionally, illness and other unexpected crises can add to budgeting challenges.
- 6. False While natural disasters such as drought can cause famines, hunger is primarily caused by poverty (not having enough money to purchase food). However, when disasters such as hurricanes and earthquakes hit, it is people with the least resources who don't have the funds for health care, to rebuild, or to move, if necessary. 7. False Some studies indicate that more than 40 percent of food grown and produced in the United States is wasted. Waste happens on farms,

- in stores, restaurants, and homes. Food banks reduce waste by gleaning, recovering, and redistributing food and other products that for various reasons are not marketable, despite being usable and edible.
- 8. False Hunger is a big problem for a lot of people around the world. There are 925 million people in the entire world who face hunger regularly. In the United States, 48.8 million people live in homes that struggle with hunger. How many people live in poverty in your state? There are many ways to get involved in the fight to end hunger let's get started!
- 9. False Kids can do LOTS of things to help end hunger. Kids can raise awareness, volunteer, organize food drives, and learn about the needs within their own community!

# Scholarships for Seniors

Missouri 4-H Foundation: The Missouri 4-H Foundation offers educational scholarships for 4-H youth and former 4-H members pursuing post-secondary study. Sixty scholarships are available, each ranging from \$500 to \$2,500. One scholarship application permits the applicant to be considered for any available scholarship, subject to conditions specified by the donor. West Central Electric: WCE offers three scholarship programs to graduating seniors in our service area. The John and Kathryn English Scholarship Trust is a renewable scholarship given to seniors active in 4-H. Scholarship amounts depend on the current status of the trust fund. Applications are due on or before February 22, 2019. This year up to 20 high school seniors will receive the WCE Scholarship of \$500. Applications are due on or before March 15, 2019. The WCE and Lynn State Technical College Electrical Distribution System Scholarship Program provides for students a two-year scholarship in a quality college training program, a two-year college degree, and on-the-job training. Applications are due on or before April 1, 2019.
