Clover Kids - Weave a Flag

In the United States, **Flag Day** is celebrated on June 14. It commemorates the adoption of the **flag** of the United States on June 14, 1777 by resolution of the Second Continental Congress.

Materials needed:

- 1. Copy of 4-H flag template for each 4-H Cloverbud member. (See page 15) This should be copied onto white card stock.
- 2. Green crayons.
- 3. Yellow or gold yarn. Each member will need 8 feet to complete one flag.
- 4. Yard stick or measuring tape.
- 5. Scissors.
- 6. Hole punchers.
- 7. Masking tape.


Instructions:

- 1. Have Cloverbuds use a hole puncher and punch-out each black dot around the edge of the flag.
- 2. Use a green crayon and color the clover.
- 3. Give each Cloverbud an 8 foot piece of yarn. If you find that 8 foot is too much yarn for them to manage, it can be cut into smaller pieces and then tied back together during the weaving process.
- 4. Help the Cloverbuds tape one end of the yarn to the back of the flag. It is best to tape this close to edge where they will begin weaving.
- 5. On the other end of the yarn, wrap a small piece of tape around the yarn to help stiffen the yarn. This will make weaving easier for the Cloverbuds and keep the yarn from fraying.
- 6. Now begin weaving. Start by bringing the yarn up through the hole closest to where it is taped. Snug all the yarn up through the hole. Again, weave the yarn up through the next hole and snug. Continue doing this until the outside of the flag is woven.
- 7. When weaving is complete you might need to help the Cloverbuds "re-snug" the yarn. Then snip off any extra

For old business Kailee L and Isabell A talked about their YCLS trip and that they are going to need help with their service project which is making and painting bird houses




for the elderly.



We decided to go on the \$500 trip to Warm Springs and would be funded by the club.



High Point/Reserve High Point ALL AROUND (one rider & one horse team) and High Point/Reserve High Point RIDER (awarded to exhibitors who MUST show multiple horses) will be given in each division: Walk-Trot, 13&U, and 14&O. (See Rules IV. Page 4)

- Prior to showing, exhibitors must select which award best suits their riding scenario and sign up for eligibility. To qualify for a high point award, exhibitors must NOMINATE themselves when entering. They must choose between High Point ALL AROUND or High Point RIDER (You may NOT receive both High Point ALL AROUND and the High Point RIDER.)
- To qualify for a High Point ALL AROUND/High Point RIDER award, the exhibitor must show in showmanship. Points earned in "All Ages" or "Ponies" classes contribute towards your High Point age Category, unless specified.
- If you choose to show a horse in the "Ponies" Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure, you may ONLY show that horse in "Ponies" classes. You can NOT show the same horse in "Ponies," "Qtr.," or "Saddle type" classes. Select ONE Hunter Under Saddle or Western Pleasure class that best represents the particular horse that is being exhibited. (See Rules III.G.3. Page 2)
- Each exhibitor may only show one horse per class.
- WALK-TROT may NOT enter classes that lope. Walk-Trot is "recommended" for exhibitors in their 1st or 2nd year of the horse project and have not won a ribbon at the Missouri State Fair 4-H/FFA Horse Show.

*Properly fitted ASTM and SEI certified helmets will be required for all events in classes 7-17 and 34-45. A rider will be disqualified if the helmet is not on the exhibitor's head and fastened for the entire time the exhibitor is in the arena.

What is 4-H County Council? The Pettis County 4-H Council is an organized committee comprised of elected Council officers and club representatives. The county 4-H Youth Council provides members with an opportunity to develop enhanced citizenship and leadership skills, serve as local 4-H ambassadors, function as youth-client advisors, and leverage 4-H programming with their peers. The County Council meets four or more times a year to conduct business, educational meetings, plan community service projects, and enjoy the company of fellow 4-H'ers. All 4-H members, parents, and leaders are welcome to attend meetings. The County Council also has a district and state counterpart.

Who Can Become a Member? You can become a member of the Pettis County 4-H Council in one of two ways: 1. Be elected to a County Council office. 2. Be a club representative (each club selects a representative to the Council; the representative is usually the club president). Remember, any 4-H member can attend and participate in Council meetings and activities. However, only officers and club representatives are voting members.

Secretary • Calls Council roll at each meeting and activity and records attendance. • Takes sufficient notes of all discussion and business to write accurate minutes of the meeting. Also, keeps a hard copy of each meeting agenda. •

Maintains a secretary's book. Reads minutes at each meeting and asks if there are any corrections. Informs members of next meeting place and time. Turns in a completed secretary's notebook at end of term. Responsible for registration desk and member sign-in at all Council meetings and county 4-H programs. Reporter Submits articles for the County Newsletter. Establishes contact with and maintains a working relationship with all club reporters and the district reporter. Assists in taking photographs at all 4-H events.
