Clover Kids - INCHWORM RACE

Cut a strip of paper about 6 inches and an inch wide. Bend the strip in the middle. Tape a penny to each end. have a contest by blowing on it through a straw to make it move.



What you need:

paper


pennies (two per worm)

scissors


double-stick tape

crayons, markers or something to decorate your worm (optional)

drinking straw



Step 4: fold the ends of the worm so that the middle curves up. Step 5: race the worms by blowing air on the front of the worm and then the back of the worm through your straw. Unless you have a very narrow table across which to race your worms, only two racers recommended at a time.

Zachary Weber moved to adjourn the meeting. Next meeting will be Sept 9 at 6:30.





The youth wearing green polo's are officers for the Pettis County 4-H Council. Our 4-H Council is the governing body over the whole county, kind of like your club officers are the governing body of your 4-H club.

Each club has a certain number of 4-H County Council Representatives. Their job, once elected, is to be the link between their club and Pettis County 4-H. They attend the bi-monthly 4-H County Council meetings and help make decisions about events and projects that they then plan and carryout. Out of the 4-H County Council Representatives, we have Officer Elections, just like in your club.

4-H County Council is such a good place to practice leadership, communication and citizenship. The Council Officers are readily seen in our community as youth who make a difference, and work hard to make the best better.

Joining 4-H County Council does take time and commitment from those who participate, but in doing so, you will learn leadership skills, responsibility and caring. Managed Care Coverage for 4-H Membership Dues

Youth covered by MO HealthNet Managed Care plans may be eligible to have their membership in one afterschool program or club paid by their insurance company. This includes membership fees for 4-H clubs!

Call the Member Services number and request a voucher for each child.

MissouriCare 1-800-322-6027

United Healthcare (Does not cover 4-H membership at this time.)

The insurance company will verify eligibility and send a voucher in the mail.

Sign and date the voucher form and send the original form to your County Extension office.

The County Extension office will send the forms to the State 4-H office and your child's membership will become active.

Please Register at 4-HOnline

Have you updated your 4-H Registration at 4-HOnline? As most of your projects and state events require an "ACTIVE" status to even register, Please, get it done as soon as possible. The state would like to see all re-enrollments complete by December 31, 2018.

Here are the steps you will need to take to get enrolled.

- 1. Go to http://mo.4honline.com (notice there is no "www" in that address).
- 2. Log in to your family profile with your log-in email address. (If you can't remember your password, select "I forgot my password") Continue to your Family Member list.
- Select "Edit" next to the member you are re-enrolling.
- 4. Select "Enroll for 2018-2019" at the bottom of the first page.
- 5. Review all content in the member profile, update any health form changes and change any projects (if you aren't enrolling in a project, delete it for this year).
- 6. Submit your enrollment, and pay required dues reflected on member invoices.
- 7. Please, please do NOT create a new profile, just update the old one. Even if your email address has changed, still use the old one to log in and then update to your new email address.

Again, this year all state event registrations will require a member to be in "Active" status in 4-HOnline. Members will remain in "Pending" status until the county review of membership and state membership dues are processed. Adult volunteer applicants remain in "Pending" status until all steps of the volunteer process are completed. If pay-paying by cash or check, you may send payment directly to the Extension Center at 1012A Thompson Blvd, Sedalia Mo 65301. Call the office at 660-827-0591 and Monica or Blake can assist as needed.

Lower Project Scholarship

This financial scholarship is funded by the Pettis County 4-H Foundation and the Pettis County Extension Council. The Lower Project Scholarship was created to give any 4-H member the opportunity to try a new project, or take a current project to a new level. The scholarship is an application for money that can help a member meet their project goals. An example of this might be a request for money to buy a horse riding helmet, a fishing pole, or cooking utensils. In the past Instructional Books, photography equipment and clothing has been obtained by utilizing this scholarship.

Members may not apply for money to be used for perishable items such as animal feed, but could be used for a show stick.

Scholarships are due to the Extension Center by October 15. Winners will be selected from a committee made up of the two funding organizations. Winners are invited to the next Pettis County Extension Council meeting, which will be held at the Pettis County Extension Office Conference Room on Tuesday, November 5, 2019 at 7:00 pm. Be prepared to give a short presentation about your project and how the awarded funds will be used. After the presentation, we will take a group photo. Following the photo, we will have a short break, before we resume into the business session of the extension council meeting.

Lower Project Scholarship checks will be dispersed at the Pettis County 4-H Recognition Banquet in November. Where you will again be asked to give a short presentation about your project and how the awarded funds will be used. Remember the funds are not to be used for perishable items.

Members must have an active status in 4-H Online and enrolled in the project in which the scholarship is requested.

No funds will be awarded or dispersed until these conditions are met.

As part of the agreement, you are required to submit a receipt of purchase and/or photo of purchase and/or a short written description of purchase and how it was used.

You must also complete both the Yearly Project Record and the Missouri 4-H Recognition forms.
