You can access past year's project enrollment data by running the member-enrollment history report. From your homepage in 4HOnline, click continue to family (big orange button). On the member's page, at the bottom in a gray box, there will be member reports. Select the member in the top pull down menu and the report title in the second. You can also print your own health or authorization forms from here.



Missouri Shooting Sports State Team Tryout Dates

The selection process for the nine state shooting teams begins this fall after the completion of the state shoot. 4-H youth selected for the state shooting teams will represent Missouri 4-H at the National Invitational Match to be held June 21 - June 26 in Grand Island, Nebraska. Any 4-H Shooting Sports member who is in good standing with their county program, enrolled in the appropriate project number and at least 14 years old (must be 14 years old by December 31, 2019) may participate in the selection process. If numbers and space allows, 13-year-olds may participate for the experience, but are not eligible for the state team. Nearly all of the team selection process is comprised of multiple try out dates. Pre-registration form is required with payment due 2 weeks before first disciple tryout. Telling the state instructor does not qualify for pre-registration. Contact Jim Sappington with questions.
