## BRONZE SEAL

- \_\_\_\_\_ 1) Recruit and mentor new members and their families
- \_\_\_\_\_ 2) Have necessary adult club, project and activity leaders
- \_\_\_\_\_ 3) Hold four or more club meetings. Include recreation, education, and business.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 4) Have at least one project group with a minimum of six hours of hands-on learning.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 5) Have enrollment records on file in the Extension Center
- \_\_\_\_\_ 6) Plan, implement and evaluate a community service project.

## SILVER SEAL

- \_\_\_\_\_ 1) Recruit and mentor new members and their families
- \_\_\_\_\_ 2) Have necessary officers – President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Reporter
- \_\_\_\_\_ 3) Have necessary adult club, project and activity leaders
- \_\_\_\_\_ 4) Hold eight or more club meetings. Include recreation, education, and business.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 5) Hold at least one hands-on project with a minimum of six hours of hands-on learning.
- \_\_\_\_\_ 6) A planned program (copy on file in the Extension Center) that includes at least:
  - One demonstration, exhibition or judging experience
  - AND one health or safety program
  - AND one planned recreation activity
  - AND one community service project
- \_\_\_\_\_ 7) Leaders participate in Leader's Coffee, 4-H Council meetings and leader trainings
- \_\_\_\_\_ 8) Achieve two or more goals in the club's planned program
- \_\_\_\_\_ 9) Have enrollment records on file in the Extension Center
- \_\_\_\_\_ 10) Sixty-five percent or more of members complete at least one project

## GOLD SEAL
