Non-Traditional Career Day Event on Campus

The next non-traditional career day on the MU campus for middle school students from Mid-Missouri is quickly approaching, Friday, November 8. Dates have also been set for middle school career day events at CMU, MACC, State Tech, and Pike/Lincoln Tech Center

Once each semester, these events are organized by Heart of MO RPDC and DESE Career Pathways. The 4-H Center provides assistance with the MU event, to remind schools and students about 4-H as a resource in their communities to find and pursue their sparks (i.e. robotics, foods, etc). Middle schools from 15 mid-Missouri counties are invited, although schools from outside the 15-county area may also attend. Missouri Shooting Sports State Team Tryout Dates

The selection process for the nine state shooting teams begins this fall after the completion of the state shoot. 4-H youth selected for the state shooting teams will represent Missouri 4-H at the National Invitational Match to be held June 21 - June 26 in Grand Island, Nebraska. Any 4-H Shooting Sports member who is in good standing with their county program, enrolled in the appropriate project number and at least 14 years old (must be 14 years old by December 31, 2019) may participate in the selection process. If numbers and space allows, 13-year-olds may participate for the experience, but are not eligible for the state team. Nearly all of the team selection process is comprised of multiple try out dates. Pre-registration form is required with payment due 2 weeks before first discipline tryout. Telling the state instructor does not qualify for pre-registration. Contact Jim Sappington with questions.
